



From the Pastor:


Let mutual love continue...Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God. -Hebrews 13:1;16

In a year where “love” is our focus and theme, it’s that much more important to remember that Jesus says the most important principles by which we are to live our lives are love God with everything that we are and love our neighbors as ourselves. Although simple sounding, the brokenness of the world and messy, busyness of our lives can leave us unsure of how to actually follow Jesus in this Way. Gathering for worship, attending Sunday school, participating in Bible study, contributing our time, talents, and treasures to the ministry of the faithful all help to teach and reteach us what it means to put God first and the needs of others before our own. Let me let you in on a secret. Each year our youth go on a Mission Trip. This year it was a Beach and Service trip again. However, these trips are actually at their heart training sessions for living Jesus’ command to love God and our neighbor.

Jesus would often go away to a secluded place to pray and reconnect with God the Father. Now, there’s nothing secluded about Ocean City, MD, except perhaps the beach forty minutes before sunrise, but it’s still away from the routines and demands we experience here. Twice each day, we gathered together to read Scripture out loud and discuss what it meant for our trip and wider lives. We prayed together. Everyone offered something, because everyone can pray. Relationships need communication and these connections. The community of faith needs time together to get to know each other and strengthen our fellowship just like we need that time and communication with God. Love is nurtured in this way.

We served servants and strangers and stewarded creation, just as God intended. This is literally The Way. Relationships with the wider body of Christ were created where none had been before because we walked together looking out for the vulnerable and marginalized. Because love bloomed, conversations happened, and the needs and struggles of our newly revealed neighbors became known. We prayed more and loved all the more.

As much as we enjoyed the power-washing, weeding, food organizing, gardening, and dune cleaning, there were opportunities for more fun too. Because joy is found in God and God in joy, God’s presence was found in the rainbow that stretched out of the ocean and across the afternoon sky, in volleyball games and the new neighbors we met there, and board games. We came to realize that the more attuned to God’s presence you are, the more you feel it and the love that carries us in all our moments. I believe this is why strangers stopped to talk to us outside Rose’s store of many things, why they helped us get on the fishing boat when a mix up seemed like it would make us miss that opportunity, and why a Jesus-loving college guy came over from his friends to hit the volleyball around a little. Scripture reading, prayer, service, and togetherness had tuned us like the strings of a piano and we, in turn, reverberated the love of God in a way that others could sense like music in the midst of noise.

"Jesus is here." During a brief pit stop at Gettysburg seminary on our way home from Maryland, we found these 3 small words etched into a once freshly poured sidewalk by our very own Pastor Johns. This small, but very true reminder summed up our trip in 3 simple words: Jesus is here.

Upon leaving the church early Monday morning siblings sat next to siblings, and friends next to friends as we started the seven hour journey to Maryland. At first it seemed as if these divisions of ours would remain throughout the trip, but by the end of the drive, we were all talking and getting to know each other better.

After unloading our bags at the retreat center we realized there was a problem with the lock on the main door. While the locksmith came and accessed the situation, we were given another opportunity to spend time with one another. We took this time to play games. This hour of game time helped us to get to know each other even better. Once we got the okay, we headed to the beach, not as a group of individuals, but as a unified group ready to take on a week of service.

After our devotion time on Monday evening, we made plans to watch the sunrise on Tuesday morning. At the time, I was very excited to get up early and watch this beautiful event, but when I woke up Tuesday morning, I wasn't feeling quite the same way. When my alarm went off that morning I seriously considered the extra hour of rest before the day of work ahead. But I decided that the sunrise was not something I wanted to miss no matter how tired I was. I'm glad I came to that decision. The view of the horizon itself was slightly obstructed by clouds, but of course the sunrise was beautiful. As the sun began to rise I noticed a dorsal fin out in the waves. Within minutes there was a whole pod of dolphins right in front of us playing in the waves.

After we got back to the retreat center, we all got ready to go to Believe in Tomorrow, a vacation home for children with terminal illnesses and their families. Once we arrived at the building, we met Mary. Mary is one of the key organizers at the Believe in Tomorrow organization. Once Mary got back to her work, Frank, another helper at the foundation, gave us our jobs. We were cleaning and organizing different parts of the center. At first everyone was split up throughout the center working on a number of tasks, but once we finished we all met on the main level to power spray the deck and clean some windows and other things.

Cora and I started cleaning the outside windows and windowsills of the families' units. As we worked our way down the outside, we scrubbed the window and windowsill of the last unit when two little faces peeked up from behind the blinds. As we cleaned, these littles ones made faces at us that were returned as funny as possible. After one of us made a face, they would collapse on the floor with laughter and then pull themselves back up to keep playing this game. Their joy was truly infectious! My heart broke when we had to leave, but there was still more work to be done. So we waved, and they waved back; a mutual understanding that our time together for the day was over, but that those few moments of giggles were priceless.

Our final day of service started with a fishing trip. This was something I had never done before and was a little nervous about. I have a tendency to get motion sick, so the prospect of being on a rocking boat did not bode well with me and I considered staying with my mom back at the shore. But with Pastor's reassurance, I decided that it was at least worth a try. I had so much fun! It took me a little bit to understand the basics, but with Pastor's patience and "pro-tips" I started to learn. After catching a couple small flounder, I mustered up enough courage to touch those slimy minnows and put the bait on my hook by myself. During the whole trip, when any one of us would catch a fish, no matter how small, we were so happy for each other. We had come together as a group to the point where a success for one person was a success for us all!



After our fishing trip we headed off to Diakonia for some more service. Upon our arrival, we met one of the happiest people I have ever met, Susan. Susan greeted us and started telling us about the work we would be doing. We started by moving boxes and bags full of canned goods from one building into another. After we moved those items, we were able to split up into small groups to do a number of odd jobs around the property. My mom and I were working on weeding. As we worked our way around the building, we looked back at our work and thought that just pulling the weeds wasn't making that big of a difference. We decided to find a rake and other supplies to see what else we could do to clean things up. As we worked, Mary came to check on our progress. What seemed like a simple clean-up to us, was a source of great excitement for Mary. After everyone finished their jobs, we had the opportunity to pray with Mary for some upcoming construction they were planning. Before we left, she thanked us for our prayers and our service; she made it clear that the same jobs that seemed small to us, were a great help to her.

Our final evening on the beach was primarily spent playing volleyball. One thing I learned from our very first board game at the retreat center was that we are all intensely competitive; volleyball was no different. After our first 5 games, we decided to take a brief break to go swimming. As the sun set and things cooled off, the weather was perfect to resume playing. We all got out of the water and quickly realized that there were other people playing on the net we were using. We decided to go over and ask them if we could play with them. With Sophie and Will's kindness, we were able to play 5 more games with 2 new players.

On our trip we met a number of incredible people, had the opportunity to help in a variety of ways, and more than anything else, we were able to experience God over and over again.

One thing I learned on this trip is that I have a tendency to forget that the same God that created and sustains the entire universe, is with me while I am at school taking a test or while I drive to archery practice. So yes, Jesus is here. He is with you as you sit in your living room, church pew, or porch reading this newsletter. He is with you as you drive to work or grocery shop for the week. Jesus is here. He is in, around, and with us everyday; we just have to remember to look for him even in the little things.

On this trip I was able to experience God in the kind, hospitable faces of our greeters, Lorena and Susanne, at the resort. In the picture perfect sunrise complete with dolphins Tuesday morning. In the laughter of the little ones at Believe in Tomorrow and in the joy of Mary at Diakonia. And finally in the numerous ways our church family made this very trip possible. From attending fundraisers hosted by the youth group, to sending in more donations for the organizations we served at, and even for the prayers that were lifted up on our behalf, this trip would not have been possible without my church family and for that I am incredibly thankful. This was an opportunity for me to truly get closer with other youth members. It was a chance for me to see, in real action, that God is always with us; we just have to be willing to look for him. Jesus is here.

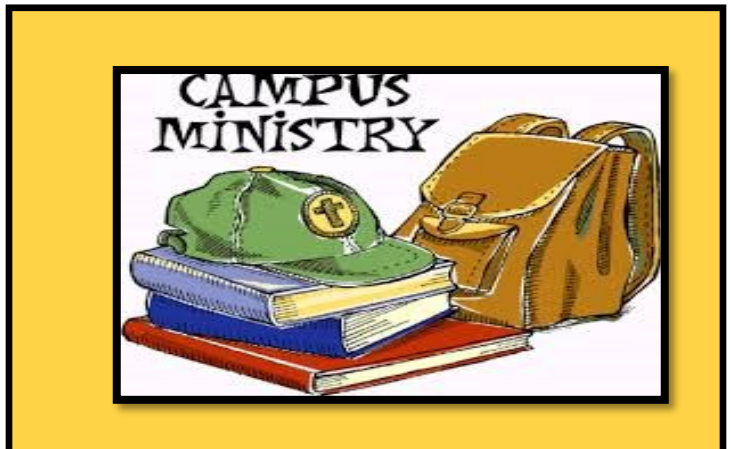
