



From the Pastor:

“When the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.” Titus 3:4-7

The first day of winter in our part of the world doesn't come until the end of this month. Obviously, it's not winter yet. On the other hand, it has snowed already, and I feel like I need to wear long underwear to make it through my commute to the office. My senses tell me that it sure seems like winter outside, which will only be more true in the coming days. For the first three weeks of December, it will be winter here already, but actually not yet. The already, but not yet blended nature of December is a helpful, experiential reminder that we Christians always live our earthly lives in the balance of already, but not yet.

In Advent, we look to the preparations that were made for the first coming of the Messiah as inspiration and assurance while we ready ourselves for the time when Jesus comes again, all the while trusting in God's living presence with us now. Christ has come, Christ is come, Christ is coming. Already the reign of God has broken into the world, signified by the angels singing to the shepherds, the heavens opening in Jesus' baptism, and the curtain of the Temple tearing at his death. Yet, we know that the world in its current state does not reflect the fullness of the divine life already.

December holds together also the what was and what is in addition to the what is and what will be. As Advent, Christmas, and December intermingle, we find ourselves living in beautiful blending of old and new, of what was and what has come. Our liturgical calendar has reset and tells us we are in a new season. The secular calendar, however, has not yet flipped. December is the crowning of the year, with Christmas a beautiful way to coronate it. The preparation for and celebration of the birth of the Christ Child are splendid ways to begin anew the rhythms of our worship life.

Christmas, itself, is the blending of an ending and a beginning. Despite humanity's fall away from right relationship with God and Creation, God immediately began the work of restoration. When Law and Covenant did not move us, God made plans for a new way of being connected. Prophets were inspired to prepare God's people for the coming of a messiah. In the fullness of time, God acted, bringing to bear in a baby the culmination of God's will and desire.

This culmination through incarnation is like harvesting the moment, just when the moment was at peak ripeness. Prophets foretelling was finished. Testifying to the Truth took its turn. When God's evaluation of the cosmos and the eons identified the most opportune time for God to bring about God's purpose (the *"kairos"*), God shifted from planning the inbreaking of salvation to enacting it in Jesus through his birth into the world and time (*"chronos"*). Still, this incarnational ministry wiped out sin, not the salvation work God had done already, but rather built upon it, enfolded it into all that would be in the eternal love of God in Jesus.

All year long we have focused on the theme of Love. Now that we have reached December, that song is reaching its crescendo. Soon it will cede its solo, decrescendo, and rejoin the chorus. Love will be every bit as important as ever, but it will give up at least a bit of its spotlight. Oh, but not yet!

For now, in December, her notes ring melodically in tones truer and clearer than at almost any other point in the year. Even the heavens could not contain the joy of the angels as their chords echoed into human time and place. Glory to God! Listen! Salvation is to be found. God has broken through the muted darkness. God has broken down the sound barriers blocking His Word. God has broken into the world, our lives, our hearts. The Messiah is here! Love has been born.

In love, God conceived a people and when they wandered off, conceived of ways to woo them back. Divine love is patiently persistent in its undaunted care for the other. In love, God made promises, bound the Creator to the Creation, the Infinite to the finite, and in Jesus, kept those promises so that all people could know peace through trust in the Eternal One. Divine serves; divine love gives. Divine love is true; divine love never ends.

Love is Creation's genesis and in love the Body of Christ finds our regeneration. Divine love is the Way and Christ comes that the Way might be made clear. Yes, the cross and empty tomb sing of God's love in mystical melodies, but the baby in the rough-hewn manger begins that anthem on note that is approachable. Here among the ordinary creatures, I see that God's love is for ordinary creatures like me. The carols aren't just for the angels. God's chorus of love has a place for the off-key like me. Glory to God! Salvation has come down, all the way down low, to me, and to you, wherever you are on the scale.

No matter how discordant December feels, Christmas, celebrating the Nativity of our Lord, is all about love. It's why our feelings are so rich in those days, sometimes joyfully so, others, painfully. Love broke through in Bethlehem, but it continues to do so in our hearts and lives today. Christmas brings to us the feeling of the Divine promise of perfect, everlasting love in an already way that is more real than at any other time in our daily living of the not yet. When we join our candle lights and hushed toned voices together, we know love has come to us. Know that the veil may be thinnest at Christmas but it's truth is for always.

Finally, good Christian friend, add to the light. Be a part of the song. God's love has a place for you and the whole so-loved world. Let them know. Sing it strong. Glory to God. Love is alive!

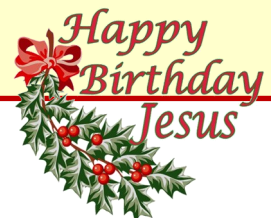
Epiphany Luncheon

Vice President Robin Van Dyke called the meeting to order at 7:12 pm and Pastor Johns led us in prayer.

Minutes: Minutes from the September meeting were read. Rob motioned to accept the minutes, 2nd by Marlene, with one minor typo amended. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report and Financial Secretary Report: Written reports submitted. Marlene motioned to accept the report, 2nd by Patti. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Written report submitted. There was discussion concerning the funding that was donated to assist our sister synod in Madagascar. Pastor is the chair of that synod committee. It was suggested that some of the school kits we collect could be sent there. Pastor also thanked Pastor Banyay for covering for him during his unexpected absence.

Fellowship: Written report submitted. The Turkey Dinner will be November 12 as a drive-through.

Finance: Budget for 2023 will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting on November 13.

Learning Ministry/Youth: Written report submitted. The committee recommends Pumpkin Fest donations to go to the After School Program. Recommendation passed. There are 15 enrolled in ASP. Rummage sale brought in about \$1500. Substitute teachers still needed for Sunday School. SPY/Jr SPY events are ongoing through the fall.

Mutual Ministry: No meeting.

Property: Written report submitted. The committee recommends approving the replacement of the boiler by B&P Technical Services at a cost of approximately \$41,000. This also includes replacement of pumps and valves. The previous bid by Armstrong was updated and is now significantly more. Debbie motioned and 2nd by Patti to approve the recommendation, contingent on it passing at the Congregational Meeting on Nov. 13.

Music & Worship: Written report submitted. No action items needed. There was extended discussion of the Jason family and how they could be assisted.

Anniversary: Report given. Several ideas being discussed. They are looking for a theme. More people are welcome to join the anniversary committee th the next meeting being Dec. 12 at 7:00.

Nominating: The 4 council members whose terms are completing are all eligible for renomination to a second term and all 4 agreed to serve again. The congregation will vote on Adam, Rita, Casey, and Dan at the Congregational Meeting. Delegates need to be found for Synod Assembly.

Unfinished Business: It was decided that the ribbons can come down on the nave seating. ... There was discussion of the benevolence line item in the budget. Adam motioned to increase the goal by \$250 to a total of \$14,000. Debbie 2nd. Motion passed.

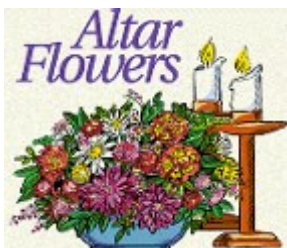

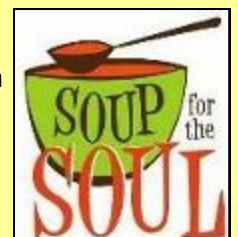
