From the Pastor:

"But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness." 1 Timothy 6:11

"Is the Pastor here?"

It's a question that I've heard plenty of times. Often, I'm right in front of the person dissecting a bulletin or catching up on member news, but my button-up shirt doesn't immediately give me away. At least when you all ask that question, it's because I've chosen to sit in my office with the light off in an attempt to cut costs.

Before the answer can be given, the stranger asks again, this time adding emphasis by including the detail that he really needs to talk, which makes me uneasy. Immediately, I mentally begin to diagnose this roughish looking man. There's white in his long hair and mustache, a hint of smoke on his faded clothes, and it's hard to tell if he's as old as I think or life has aged him more than his years. My snap reaction is that this will be a plea for money.

"You're in luck! Pastor is right here," Heidi says before my judgmental thoughts allow for a verbal response. This snaps me back to the present moment and to the stranger who is a guest but feels like an intruder. I remember my manners, standing, offering my hand to shake, introducing myself. He's relieved to have found me. I'm worried about what trouble this encounter will cause. As he accepts my invitation to sit together in my office, I steel myself for the task of trying to decide if his forthcoming request for financial assistance will be legitimate or not.

Conversation flows, mostly one-sided though as a lifetime of challenges and struggles find their way into the light. At some point, it dawns on me that our visitor has not come for money. He just needs someone to talk to and maybe give some advice on his current problem. I didn't even have to do that. Just saying the situation out loud led him to discern what God's path for him would be.

My heart and mind had raced ahead putting this child of God in a box of my own making, dreading meeting demands that were never made. Although time is more precious than money, I was much more able to give that openly and generously. After some considerable time passes and both of us are breathing easier, he finally asks for something, in a halting but hopeful way. He wonders if he could have communion. Gladly do I share with him prayers and bread and wine which convey the real presence of Christ, so precious compared to the treasures I thought I would be stewarding.

After our brother in Christ leaves enlivened by our time and the Sacrament, I feel joyful and foolish at the same time. I had been judgmental and anxious. Fortunately, God had used me anyhow. My hospitality mirrored my brokenness, but God still made me an instrument of his love and grace. Humbled, God also reminded me to listen and love first and with a wideness that reflects God who is the source.

Saint Paul poetically elaborates on all that love is in the book of Corinthians. Taught by this encounter, I would add a few notes in the margin. Love is patient and kind, of course, but also love listens so that the truth in which it delights can be found and the needs of others being served can truly be discerned. Listening takes the patience of love and helps us to be the kind of loving person who is not self-seeking or judgmental.

Paul writes that love never fails, and that's true. However, these broken vessels that have been graced with God's love do fail. I am filled and refilled by God's love so that I can freely share it with others but time and again, I fail. Thankfully, it is God's love that lives in me and live in you, and God always finds a way to use us, his beloved, to accomplish his loving will for all creation.

That loving will creates and recreates relationships. To add one more bullet point to Paul's list, love connects. Connection is ultimately what our new friend needed, and connection is one of the most genuine ways we can share God's love.

Speaking of greeting/ welcoming others...

This summer we restarted the practice of having greeters as part of our Sunday morning volunteers. We need your help! Just about everyone will likely find themselves on the list of greeters sometime in the next few months. Greeters should arrive no later than 20 minutes before worship time. One person should stand near the main doors in the back of the nave and one should stand near the entrance to the nave from Luther Hall. Greeters should hand out the bulletins to those people arriving and have a friendly greeting. Greeters also should assist any visitors who arrive. For example, explaining that communion happens at the rail or at your seat if you're not comfortable going forward is helpful information for visitors. So as we went through our days filled to the brim I tried to really focus and listen and look for God all around me. Although I may not have heard the booming voice of God, I saw him in the beauty all around me. I saw God’s wonder in the beach at first daylight. I saw it in the smiles of children as they watched us clean their windows, but most of all I saw it in my church family. I watched as we all went from acquaintances to friends. I witnessed the acts of loving kindness done by the people around me and I saw how they emulated God’s light. I’d like to thank the congregation not only for our trip, but for the impact it had on me. I went on this trip knowing I would have fun, but not expecting much else. However, on this trip I discovered something far more important than I expected. I found joy in the presence of others and peace knowing God is always there for me.

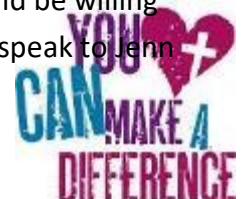

President Dan Erin called the meeting to order at 7:25 pm and Pastor Johns led us in prayers of open arms.

Minutes: June 14th, 2022 minutes were read. Rob motioned to accept the minutes, 2nd by Adam. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report and Financial Secretary Report: Written reports submitted. The brick loan pay off letter has been received. There will be a Finance Meeting soon.

Pastor's Report: Written report submitted. Vic and Brenda Peffer are looking to become members of St. Peters. Rita motioned to accept the Peffers becoming members. Dan 2nd the motion.
