Terms and conditions apply. See store for details. An asterisk followed by fine print. Talking so fast that you can only pick up every third word. There are a lot of ways that the reality of a deal or contract get hidden right under our noses.

It was the tiny words at the bottom of coupons when shopping with my mom that first made me aware of this slight of hand. When you’re a kid, you take things at face value. So when the ad says “Everything 50% Off,” you get excited about the new outfit that you’ll be able to get now, until you realize the advertising department is a group of dream crushers because they really mean 50% off just on the stuff you didn’t want to buy. Or when the grocery store runs a Buy One Get One Free on ice cream, and you dream of loading the chest freezer in enough flavors to make Baskin-Robbins blush, until you find the asterisk there to inform you that the limit is two. Actually, one time, Giant Eagle ran a promotion on cereal that was so good, double manufacturers coupons which could also be combined with some other concurrent deal, that we got so many carts of cereal that it’s possible there’s still a box tucked somewhere into a nook or cranny at my parents’ house. Now that I mention it, maybe we’re the reason **Limit 4* started showing up on coupons, although we didn’t have more than 4 ... carts.

Contracts and agreements with pages of small printed terms and conditions are everywhere, too. Go to the roller-skating rink or a hospital for major surgery and either place you are likely going to sign something that says, tucked among countless other pages, you understand that you might die and don’t hold anyone accountable for it. Software updates and blood donating ask me to click a box saying I’ve read and understood all the information. I don’t have time to read all of that, and likely wouldn’t understand it all even if I did, which is what less savory companies are banking on happening. Still, I cringe when I click the box that says I have read and agree to the terms of service of our worship broadcasting software as it has updated right before the prelude, and I’m caught lying just before the service.

After Jesus’ resurrection, he shows up in the room with the disciples presenting them a deal. No coupons are needed. Jesus already paid the purchase price. He offers them God’s peace.

Although Jesus bought that peace with his own blood, there are terms to the agreement. However, they aren't in fine print, they aren't any asterisks, and Jesus didn't say them at an auctioneer's pace or that we'd have to see store for details. No, the terms are right there in regular-sized red-letter print. "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Jesus offers God's peace to those who receive the commission to be his "sent ones."

This is not to say that you must earn your salvation. When Jesus shows the disciples his wounds, it's like showing the receipt for the cost of our redemption. Therefore, living as "sent ones," also known as *apostles*, doesn't earn us God's grace, but rather keeps us connected to the source of our salvation, which brings us peace. On the other hand, we can ignore God's call to be living bearers of the good news according to God's will, but that separates us from God. Such separation forfeits the gift of peace with God, and prevents us from having true peace with our own selves as well.

Being attuned to God's will brings peace. Jesus, who was aware of and obedient to the will of the Father like no one else, commissions us as sent ones in the same Way. Made God's children and apostles, our very lives have been handcrafted to bear the message that God loves all people and has saved humanity through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Living in harmony with who God made us to be is the path of peace, peace with God and ourselves, as offered by Jesus. There are no better deals, no more favorable terms out there, and thankfully, no limits on this peace.

In an effort to keep everyone informed about our current financial situation the reconciled Treasurer's report of our funds **as of the end of February 2024** is as follows: Current Fund \$13,986.78, Memorial Fund \$7159.74, Youth Fund \$9,698.97, Manna Fund 4,346.51, Priority Project Fund \$15,496.19, After School Program \$10,838.74. Many thanks to those who continue to give to these funds which give us the ability to serve Christ and others.

Evans City Community Food Cupboard

During the month of April, we will collect Hamburger Helper. Donations can be placed on the table in Luther Hall and volunteers will take them to the designated spot for donations. Thank you to everyone who has donated items for our monthly ministry to the Food Cupboard.

Mission Endowment Fund Update

At the end of 2023 St. Peter's was gifted almost \$60,000 from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church as it closed it's door. They respectfully allocated funds from the sale of their church to various charitable organizations with St. Peter's being named a benefactor. Good Shepherd acknowledged Pastor Brandon Johns as a Son of their congregation and their desire to help fund future ministries at St. Peter's. Previous funds donated to St. Peter's for the purpose of a future endowment were combined for a total of \$68,562.83 in the newly named St. Peter's Good Shepherd Endowment Fund.

March 12, 2024

Reception of Visitors: None

President Adam Price called the meeting to order at 7:12 PM, and Pastor shared a reading from Thomas Merton and led us in discussion and prayer.

Minutes: Minutes from the February 20th meeting were read and adjusted. Corey motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded by Jane. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report and Financial Secretary's Reports: Written reports were submitted and approved. Clarification was addressed regarding the Porter Family Trust and the Food Cupboard. Rob motioned to accept and it was seconded by Jane. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: A written report was submitted and discussed. It was another busy month as Pastor is continuing his work at Zion and St. Paul; however, a candidate is being interviewed in the near future. The churches have not yet gathered a call committee. Chelsea Mars's son, Hudson, will be baptized here on the 1st Sunday in May.

Fellowship: A written report was submitted. A successful fish dinner was held on March 8th. Monies from the Easter Breakfast will go towards Camp Lutherlyn. A Pirate game is scheduled for Saturday, June 22nd. A Sight and Sound Theater trip is scheduled for the first Saturday in November, the 2nd. Twenty tickets have been reserved for this event. Since the committee recommended this, Corey seconded it. Motion carried.

Learning Ministry/Youth: No written report was submitted.

Memorial: No written report was submitted.

Mutual Ministry: No written report submitted.

Property: A written report was submitted. After Easter, the concrete work for the steps will commence. Spring Work Day is scheduled for 8:30 on May 18th. A discussion occurred regarding new deck boards for the parsonage. Marlene moved to approve this; it was seconded by Linda, and the motion was passed. Voles on the church grounds may be trapped. A bid was received by Caylor Hollow Pest and Wildlife. Simply trapping these was recommended. A motion to approve this was made by Jane, and Stacey seconded this. The fire extinguishers were inspected.

Worship and Music: A written report was submitted that addressed Lenten services. First Communion will be held on Palm Sunday. Liberty Merrison and Carter Johns will receive the sacrament that day. On Holy Thursday a reenactment of the Living Last Supper will be held. Good Friday Cross Walk will begin at our church with the community service being held at Westminster. Another service will be held at St. Peter's at 7:00 PM. *Keeping the Word Alive* will occur again this year beginning at 8:00 PM and continuing until Easter morning. This will occur in person and on Zoom.

Anniversary: A written report was submitted. Rita reviewed the latest news. On April 14th, Pastor Saylor will either preach or preside. The recommendation from Council would be for him to preside. On June 30th, recognition of those members 75 and above will occur. Sale of the ornaments continue. Research is continuing on the historical aspects of the church. Our youth will be involved in looking through materials including bulletins, photographs and other memorabilia. History books are being created. T-Shirts will also be made. Work is continuing on the cookbook; the last proof is being worked on now. Each weekly bulletin now contains a bit of historical information. On October 6th the dinner will be held at Camp Lutherlyn.

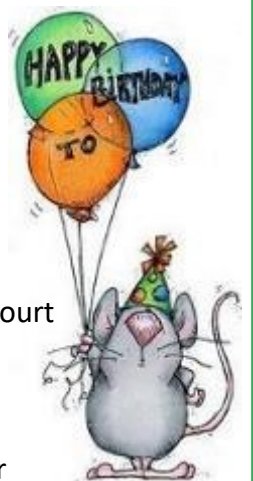
