



## From the Pastor

*“You will show me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy, and in your right hand are pleasures forevermore.” ~Psalm 16:11*

For the past few months, Kate and I had been reading the *Harry Potter* series together. She started ahead of me, and I picked up the books after her. Although Kate read them on the bus and any other moment she was

allowed, she did pause occasionally to allow me to catch up, so we read the last book, *Deathly Hallows*, at pretty much the same time from two copies. This was a lot of fun, as it gave us something more to talk about and connect with each other. We even had a conversation, initiated by Kate, of how we would handle talking about and responding to Lord Voldemort as Christians if he was really in our world. Having previously had read-and-discuss time with Lily over the *Wrinkle in Time* series, I would definitely recommend having mini book clubs with as many people as you can.

Of course, there is only so much time in the day. In the third *Harry Potter* book, Harry's friend, the ever-studious Hermione, gets a magical "time-turner" so she can take more classes. Look, I loved school, still do actually, but that's not how even I would be using an extra three hours in a day. Without a time-turner, which only exist as Harry Potter fan jewelry, we have to be that much more thoughtful about how we use our time. We can't read every book, talk to every person, do everything, or be everywhere at once. Therefore, we regularly need to prioritize how we spend our time, which reveals that which is most precious to us.

Sometimes we simply must spend our time in certain ways or places, even though we would rank the use low on our true list of priorities. However, as patterns emerge, those trends speak to what and who we are actually valuing, whether we would readily admit it or not. What we *choose* to show up for shows we value it. That which we value is that to which we will give our praise. We can't praise God without giving time to God. It rightly follows, then, that the offering of our time to and with God is one of our highest forms of praise of God.

God shows God's great love for us and value of us by the Incarnation, and quite literally, making time for us. Jesus is God-with-us. From the manger to the cross, Jesus keeps showing up for us. When Jesus asks his disciples, and us, to be with him, he isn't asking of us anything that he hasn't already done for us.

## Pastor's Page (Continued) and Holy Week

As I write this, it's Holy Week. Within these days and pages of Scripture are some of the most meaningful stories in the entire salvation narrative. What God wants to tell us and do for us can be understood most clearly right now, and our community of Jesus-followers takes the heart of our identity from Jesus' verbal and lived instructions from the upper room, the Mount of Olives, the Praetorium, Golgotha, and the garden tomb. Jesus and his disciples (not yet Judas) head from their dinner celebration, which Jesus says he was eager to share with them, to Gethsemane, where the magnitude of what he is about to face visibly shakes Jesus. He asks Peter, James, and John to be with him and keep watch with him. My heart is gripped by this simple, yet profound request. I feel it in my own soul. Jesus asks us also to be together with him – to eat with him, to sing with him, to serve with him, to stand with him, to face death with him, to show up for him, to spend our time with him and for him, to prioritize him, and to praise him with our presence.

Peter, James, and John fail. They are present but not fully. Sleep overtakes them. They flee or keep their distance and deny him. Fortunately, Jesus redeems them nonetheless. However, for a clearer example of discipleship in the moment, it's the women, rather, who accompany Jesus through it all. Despite the pain of witnessing Jesus on the cross, the women bear it. They understand the preciousness of time and give it to Jesus, no matter the cost. May we be like the women who Matthew reports accompanied Jesus all the way from Galilee to the cross, and to the tomb as well. May we answer the summons and show up with Jesus and for Jesus. May we show God as our clear priority through the dedication of our time, and continually praise God with our presence.

From the conclusion of our Good Friday evening service until the beginning of Easter service, we will read continually through the Gospel of Matthew, broken only by readers taking time for prayer or using other devotional material to reflect on the magnitude of Jesus' sacrificial love for us. Our thirty-six hour vigil represents the time Christ lay dead in the tomb, but giving audible voice to God's Word reminds us that death is not the victor in this battle. Although reading from the sanctuary offers some of the deepest spiritual benefits, we offer the opportunity to read from home through Zoom.

## Pastor's 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Call to St. Peter's & Manna Night



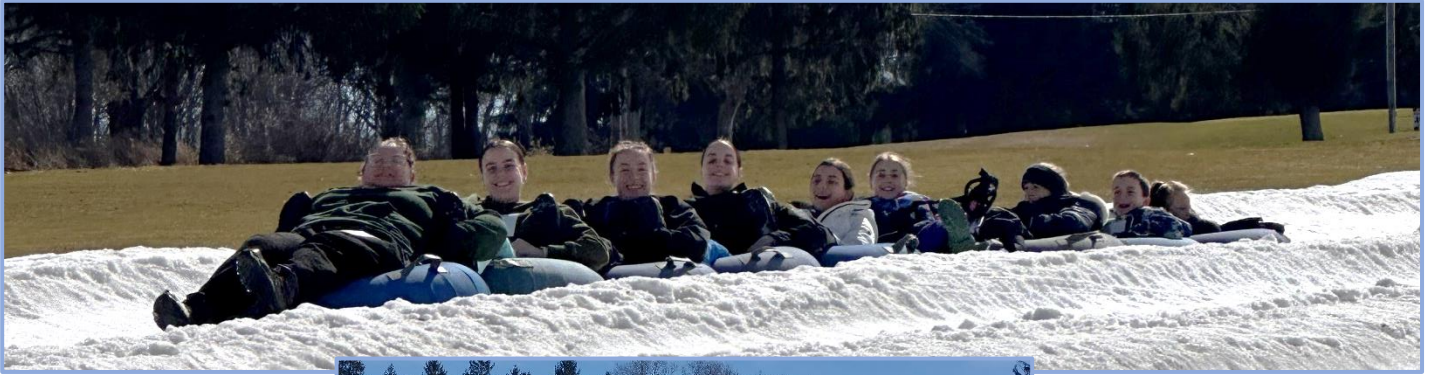

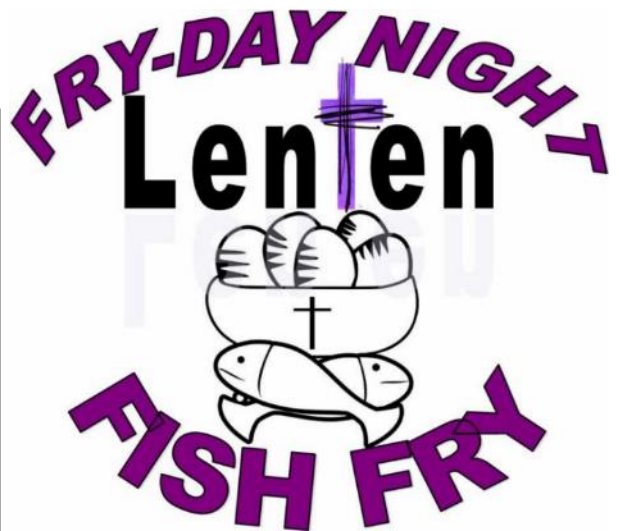

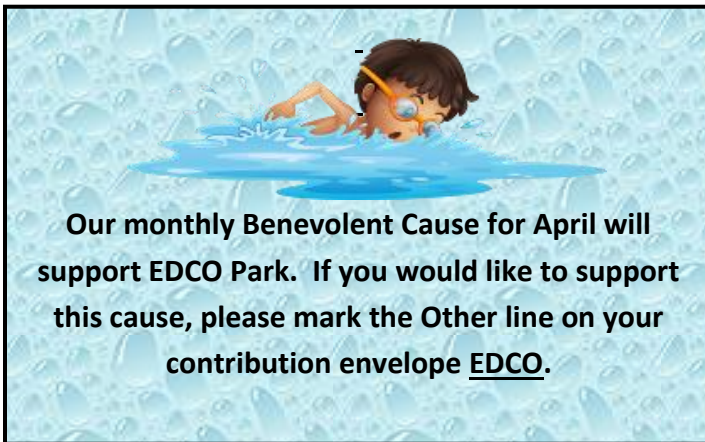
