This year, we were able to return of our usual pattern of going on a summer mission trip with our SPY group. For the first time, we headed to New Bern, NC in order to work with Coastal Carolina Disaster Resiliency Agency, whose leaders, Kristy and Jeremy, are still hard at work helping their neighbors recover from Hurricane Florence 7 years ago. We were assigned two homes that were our jobsites. Their owners had been living with mold and other damages until they found hope and help all these years later with CCDRA. Adam Price led the boys on a flooring rehabilitation project at one house, while Anna Plank led the ladies in an effort to repaint the ceilings of another house. While both projects seemed overwhelming at first, God gave us the strength and faith to find our way, step by step. Through that service work, meeting the homeowners, other sisters and brothers in Christ with whom we shared lodging and prayers, hearing their stories, and bonding together through devotions, meals, service, and play, we all grew in our faith and our bond with God and each other. What follows are the stories of those who attended. Their thoughtful reflections are uplifting and humbling. They remind me that Jesus is constantly making more of us than we realize and would ever think possible. Our youth's words of witness are God's mercy to any who wonder if God is still working for good, still with us and for us, and let us see the vision that God has for us as people called, gathered, equipped, and sent by the Holy Spirit.

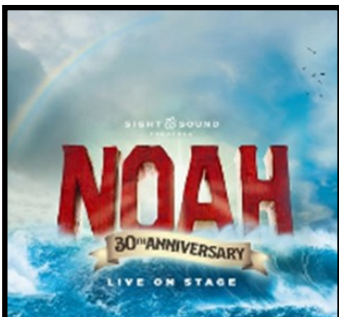
August pack up will be on Friday, August 8 at 9 am instead of 9/10 after worship.

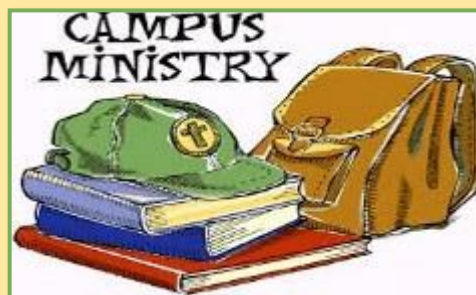
in an effort to keep everyone informed about our current financial situation the reconciled treasurers report of our Current Fund
