From the Pastor:



"Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful." Colossians 3:14-15

Lily is about to turn twelve, which is hard to believe. When you read this, she may have already turned twelve or maybe twenty. Who knows?

Anyhow, it was a couple of days into December of 2012 that I carried little baby Lily into her room for the first time and laid her in her crib, which had only been assembled days before then. I wanted to play music for her, so I went to Best Buy and purchased the only compact radio and CD player that they had left. The sales associate actually told me there weren't any left, but when I pointed out the demo model on the shelf, he agreed to sell that to me. Excited and armed with the last radio in the world, I tried to find songs suitable to play for a baby. It proved to be a challenge.

Country, Pop, and Classic Rock all proved to songs that I didn't want my sweet little Lily to hear, and I certainly didn't want to sing about drinking and revenge to her. I couldn't locate the Christian station either. Then I hit upon a station that was playing music I could sing and feel good about this new life and part of my heart hearing, with almost no problematic songs, except for Wham!, which is just bad not inappropriate. It was a station playing non-stop Christmas music. Normally, I wouldn't tune into exclusive Christmas music until days before it actually is Christmas, but that year, for that special new wonderful time, I made an exception. Christmas music played in Lily's room almost constantly during awake time for the first few weeks of Lily's life.

Besides that year, I take Advent pretty seriously. I value the emphasis on waiting and watching, the learning to anticipate and prepare. Advent is the season of our Christian lives, because we live waiting and preparing for Christ to come again. For as much as I love Christmas, and I do as much as anyone, Advent is sacred to me.

However, this year as we conclude our yearlong theme of peace, it's fair to recognize that Advent is not a season of peace by itself. It prophesizes peace. It prepares for Jesus' reign of peace. Yet without the fulfillment of God's promised Savior revealed to the world and made known to us in the birth of the babe of Bethlehem then manifested on the cross and empty tomb, peace would remain as some distant future promise.

Pastor's Page Continued

Christmas is the true season of peace, which we can see from our Scripture readings in the Advent and Christmas seasons. It's not until the last Sunday of Advent that we finally get a mention of peace. There we get a reading from Micah chapter 5, which we see as a messianic prophecy, declaring this coming ruler from Bethlehem will be great but also "the one of peace." On Christmas Eve, we get Isaiah's famous list of titles for the coming anointed one of God, including "Prince of Peace" and that because of him "there shall be endless peace." When Luke tells us the beloved story of the nativity of our Lord, he reports the heavenly hosts declaring, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" The Word is made flesh and the era of peace for God's people begins with a baby laid in a manger.

As you know after eleven of these articles, God's peace isn't the same as the world's idea of peace, which is how we can declare that we live in the reign of God's peace while wars rage in the world. God Incarnate, the Savior Jesus' entrance into time and space celebrated at Christmas, makes peace with us through loving grace. God forgives us, which is the ultimate act of peacemaking. Forgiven by God, the peace our souls receive from that blessed assurance can extend to forgiveness to each other and ourselves. We manage this reign of peace in our lives and in the world best precisely at the time when the angels declared it to be true. At Christmas, nearly the whole world finds ways to be more loving, more hospitable, and more forgiving – in other words, more peaceful in the Way God intended.

Obviously, we want the whole world to know the peace of Christmas all year long. We yearn for the days when the reign of God's peace means eternal salvation but also wars and separations to cease in this world, too. If we long for peace like this, God's will to be done on earth as in heaven, then we know that God desires it too, because Jesus encouraged us to pray for it. When Christ comes again, we believe it will be so. As we look forward to that time, which actually ends time as we know it, we find ourselves back in Advent.

The season of Advent directs us to look back to the days when God fulfilled long-awaited promises of a coming Messiah. Our hearts swell at God's entrance into the messiness of humanity, having learned through carols and candles that this time is special. Heartened by hope, Advent also turns our attention to the future as we await Jesus' second coming. In the peace granted to us at the Incarnation and Resurrection, in this peace we pray to the Lord and trust in goodness of each day and the goodness that awaits us in the end of days. Advent and Christmas are their own sacred seasons, and yet, it's clear they walk hand-in-hand, intricately, inseparably woven together.

I'm still not advocating non-stop Christmas music stations starting in November. Advent doesn't even start until December this year. However, it was the melody of Christmas that lent its peace to the first weeks of Lily's Advent life, and so it is for all of our lives. Throughout our Christian journey, we actively prepare for Christ to come again with loving, humble service, which is why I say discipleship is living Advent all year long. In the meantime, the waiting time, we are sustained by the peace of the Savior who has been born unto us, the peace of Christmas. It turns out it takes both together, to live meaningful, peaceful Christian lives.






SPY, Serving Others, and Daniel Outing

St. Peter's Lutheran Church Congregational MeetingNovember 10, 2024

Council President, Adam Price, called the meeting to order following the Sunday Service at 12:10 P.M. to address the budget, as well as to vote on new Council representatives, Mission Endowment committee members, and attendees at the Synod Conference.

After distribution and review of the suggested budget, a discussion and question and answer period occurred. Based on Synod guidelines, Pastor's salary for 2025 showed a 3% increase with an additional change addressing years of service. It was noted that the amount for utilities was less in the new budget. When this was questioned, the response indicated it was because of the decrease in natural gas prices. Also explained was the reduced budget for the After School Program that reflected the loss of one staff member due to the decrease in enrollment.

LouAnn Brosius expressed that the increase in Pastor's salary was not sufficient. When it was questioned and noted that all expenses had been met for the previous year, Heidi Beahm explained that our congregation was caring and generous and continued to address and meet our financial needs. A motion was made by Robin VanDyke and then revised to suggest a salary increase to \$55,000. This was seconded by Teresa O'Malley. Further questions were asked regarding how this might impact PORTICO (pension, health, dental and social security). Realizing that this would also then change, Robin amended her motion to increase the salary to \$55,000 and coordinate this with the new changes to the budgeted amount in this area. Motion carried.

Teresa O'Malley motioned to accept the 2025 budget with these changes. Jim Merrison seconded this. The motion carried.

Ballots for Council, Mission Endowment, and Synod Assembly representation were distributed. Pastor shared that the 3-year terms of Rob Burr, Ted Lindgren III, Marlene Domhoff and Casey Guerriero were expiring. Six names were suggested for the next term. There were no nominations from the floor, nor were there any for the additional areas requiring representation.

After voting in each area, the votes were counted by Beverly Critchlow and Robin VanDyke. While the counting was occurring, Pastor thanked all of those willing to step into all leadership roles. He also discussed the process of electing a new Bishop, as this will be of importance for the Synod Assembly this year. Pastor led us in prayers before sharing the results of voting. These were as follows:

Cindy Ayres, Casey Guerriero, Jan Hogan and Robin Plank will be the new Council members.

Charlie Flach and Heinie Raupp were elected to the Mission Endowment Fund committee.

Adam and Erin Price were chosen to attend the Synod Assembly.


