St. Peter's Lutheran Church



From the Pastor:

"Show me your ways, O Lord, and teach me your paths." Psalm 25:4

"Grace be to you and peace from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

That's a lovely way to start a letter. I didn't think it up, though, as you probably know, which is why I'm able to speak so highly of it. That opening is taken almost verbatim from the greeting portion of many of Paul's letters. Only "our" has replaced "the" and the "and Savior" has been added in above. Even then, I didn't invent those changes. I heard my pastor growing up begin each of his sermons that way, and so internalized it as the proper way to begin a sermon, until internship.

By the time I was an intern serving in northern Virginia, I had already preached many times. After all, I had started right around my seventeenth birthday. Every time I started with the slightly altered version of Paul's greeting and ended with a similar scriptural but formulaic ending I had learned from the pews. Even in my sermon-writing and delivering classes (called Homiletics), nobody mentioned that as unusual. However, after my first sermon on internship, my supervisor asked me a couple of days later why I began and ended my sermons that way. I don't drink coffee or beer, so my Lutheran status can sometimes be called into question, but not for my reasoning on this one. My answer was that I had learned to preach that way and therefore had always done it that way.

Turns out that wasn't a good enough answer to be able to move on and continue the same as always. My supervisor had a different opinion, which he shared. He said, "Look, people know that you're about to preach. It says so right in the bulletin. There's no confusion as to why you've climbed up in the pulpit, so there's no need to start with a line to clue everyone in to what you're doing. Also, when you're done, be done. Say Amen, and let that be that." I wasn't about to argue with the person who would be largely responsible for whether or not I got to continue and become a pastor, so I changed. From then on, I have started right in to the message without introduction and have said Amen at the end.

No one has ever asked me for my sermons to be longer, so I don't think anyone is hoping this story spurs me to change back. Once a year or two ago, my younger brother, who has heard sermons from me before and after the switch, asked me what happened to the line I used to use to open sermons. I explained this story, and he encouraged a switch back. I did once for him, and maybe will again. Anyhow, this has come back to mind and I'm sharing it with you, because our theme this year is peace, of course. While no one is asking for longer sermons, I believe that any of us would be glad for more peace.


Pastor's Page Continued

Paul's consistent use of peace in his greetings show his understanding of our consistent need for peace and the way offering peace heartens individual recipients and strengthens communal bonds. Our Jewish ancestors in the faith, among whom Paul and Jesus were, and our modern cousins have recognized this. Much deeper than a simple "Hello" is the Hebrew greeting "Shalom." It means peace, and not just a wish for lack of conflict between us, which is important enough on its own, but also an intentional blessing of wholeness and well-being for the person or community greeted.

Often, I consider peace to be something that I must fight to obtain, to win it somehow, or at least earn in order to possess. Shalom challenges that notion. Shalom is the ideal state for which humanity was created by God. Therefore, it is a gift of the highest order from God. After all, part of our understanding surrounding Jesus' death and resurrection are so that peace would be made between God and humanity, enabling true eternal Shalom for us. What God freely gives us, we are called to freely give to others.

Love, grace, mercy, forgiveness, hospitality, all are gifts from God that we are called to radiate out to others. Peace is, too. The Gospel of John quotes Jesus as saying to his disciples, "My peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." It's repeated for emphasis, perhaps because they might have difficulty processing a word of peace as Jesus prepares for his arrest and death. As the disciples and the communities to which Paul wrote received the word of peace in challenging times, let us hear that blessing anew in our time. You, my dear friends, have in your possession the Shalom of God, given to you by God through the Holy Spirit.

This is not a gift to be used sparingly. Once it took me two years to get through some Payday candy bars I had been given because they were a special treat that I wanted to save for just the right moments. Turns out, when they were finally used up there were loving people ready to supply me with more. Don't ration God's peace. God is loving and gladly continues to restock our hearts with holy treasures. Please consider gifting as many people you can with the blessing of Shalom. May our words and actions communicate the peace of God to all people, given away as freely as it was given to us. So I say to you, grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus. Shalom. Peace be with you. Amen.



Pastor Johns called the meeting to order at 7:40 pm and led us in devotions of peace. Dan Vichek and Andy Rider came to talk to Council about the current situation with the Cub Scouts. There was a motion to continue Pack 399 here (St. Peter's ministry) while they are hiatus, freezing all of their accounts until Fall of 2024 (the new school year). Ted motioned to accept this, Rita 2nd this.

Minutes: December 2023 minutes were read. Changes were made so that the meeting ended at 8:40pm. Ted motioned to accept the minutes, 2nd by Rita. Motion carried.

Election of Officers: Dan nominated Adam Price to be the new Council President, Linda 2nd it. Ted nominated himself to be the new Vice-President, 2nd by Casey. Treasurer's Report and Financial Secretary Report: Written reports submitted. We exceeded our Synod Benevolence goal. Ted motioned to accept the reports, 2nd by Dan.

Pastor's Report: Written report submitted. Pastor's family is going to Disney is later this month. Pastor might be relieved of interim duties. There might be possible new members, Pastor is meeting with them on January 12th.

Fellowship: Fellowship met on January 8th. They have made a calendar of events for this year.

Property: Written report submitted. \$91,000 proposal to paint the nave. They are looking into doing a sidewalk steps project by the choir room due to safety concerns. This project will also give access to the handicap parking lot, a railing would also be needed. So far there are two bids (\$14,500 and \$12,500). We would like to get another bid for this project. Council is making the recommendation to make the sidewalk steps more of a priority and to get more bids.

Music & Worship: Written report submitted. They are planning out for Lent. Looking back, Advent and Christmas went well, and everything looked great. They are finalizing the alter guild schedule. People seem to prefer "at the altar" for communion. We are thinking of doing intinction for larger gatherings/holidays.

Anniversary Committee: One month away from the kickoff with the Bishop. February 11th will be the luncheon to welcome the Bishop. We are asking people to bring a dish to share. It is the start of the 175th year of the church. October 6th will be the big dinner held at Lutherlyn. There will also be a powerpoint presentation at the dinner. There will also be a history book, recognition of 90-year-old birthdays and Jane Brown turning 100. There are patrons for the committee, 7 Thrivent cards have been used so far. They are also coming up with a t-shirt for the 175th anniversary.

Unfinished Business: No update for the Constitution update. Congregational/Bulletin of Reports will be held February 4th. Lunch will be provided by Council. Reports need to be submitted by the different committees ASAP.




