From the Pastor:

"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my strength and my redeemer." Psalm 19:14

Driving back from one of the places we had been off to recently, Kate piped up from the back seat of the van with a carefully worded question. She wanted to be clear that she wasn't asking for more presents, since we just had four Christmas celebrations and asking for presents in the Johns

household leads to trouble. No, Kate was clear she wasn't expecting more gifts. She just wanted to know if getting a gift on Epiphany had become a tradition or just something that happens occasionally.

The girls have gotten a little gift on Epiphany every year now since 2021, when I nearly made Kate cry (a story for a different time). So I told her through a stifled laugh at her dance around the rules that it might have become a tradition. Whether it is officially a family tradition or not, I do have gifts for them again this year, gifts that some of you even helped me to make (Thank you!).

Something that we have done for the last several years in our faith community is pick a word to serve as our yearly theme. Last year's was "peace," and before that were joy, love, hope, faith, grace, and thanks. I think there was another one in the early years that's slipping my mind, too. Anyhow, maybe that's enough years that having a theme is a tradition. Either way, this year we are focusing on "mercy."

I discovered last month that not everyone realizes that we have been choosing a theme annually and where that shows up in our life together. One place you'll notice it the most is in our newsletter. Each month, my opening article touches on our theme, to try to help us to grown in our understanding of how our theme word impacts our life in Christ. I also center our council devotions around the theme.

In worship, you might notice that our theme shows up more frequently in hymns, the liturgy, and the sermon. Part of this is intentional selection, because each theme has been important to understanding God and how God relates to us. The other reason you'll notice the theme word more is that your awareness of it is heightened. Over the course of this year, you might see and hear mercy in places it was all along, but had stopped noticing.

My hope is that we will all experience mercy this year in new ways and also in ways and places it's been all along but with renewed awareness. However, in order to better experience mercy in our life with God and our relationships with each other, it is important understand what the Bible has to say about mercy. When the Pharisees are blinded to Jesus' mission by self-righteousness, Jesus encourages them do exactly that. He says, "Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.'" which is a quote from Hosea.

Jesus' quote of Hosea reminds the Pharisees and us that understanding mercy is very important to understanding who God is. In understanding who God is, then we will better know who God made us to be since we were made in the image and likeness of God. Clearly, mercy is meant to be integral to how we relate to each other. For all they knew about Scripture, the Pharisees were missing that being faithful to God also means being kind and lifting each other up. God is merciful and we were made to be as well.

December 9, 2024

Reception of Visitors: 2025 New Council Members-Cindy Ayres, Jan Hogan

President Adam Price called the meeting to order at 7:10 P.M. Prior to this, the Pastor shared a devotion relating to Christmas with a focus on peace. He led us in a brief discussion followed by a prayer.

Minutes: Minutes from the November 12th meeting were read and approved. Ted motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded by Staci. Motion carried,

Pastor's Report: A detailed, written report was submitted that included Advent planning, illnesses, vacation schedules, and a meeting with the SV school superintendent. Discussion followed.

Treasurer's Report and Financial Secretary's Reports: Written reports were submitted for November. Each was reviewed prior to discussion. Of interest is why the water bill for both the church and the parsonage both reflect a large usage increase. Ted motioned to accept, and it was seconded by Rita. Motion approved.

Financial: No written report was submitted. Luminary funds raised will go toward the Batten's Foundation and the poinsettia funds will be used for Madagascar communications and assistance.

Fellowship: A written report was submitted. Numerous events were reported. The November 16th turkey dinner raised approximately \$3,300; more than 300 meals were served. Leadership from Ted Lindgren III and the SPY team for the Advent Luncheon resulted in a well-attended Advent Luncheon. The Lancaster trip for the Sight and Sound Theater was enjoyed by 22 people. Plans are being made to purchase 40 tickets to see *Noah in September of next year. Next year's Evans City Community Event will occur on the weekend of September 20th. The annual spaghetti dinner will be held on October 11th next year. In 2025, the Pumpkin Fest will take place on October 25th.*

Learning Ministry/Youth: A written report was provided. The date for the Christmas program is December 22nd. Materials for Sunday School relating to Advent were ordered. Many activities for SPY and SPY Jr. were shared. Manna Night's last 2024 date is December 10th. It will resume mid-January. The ASP enrollment could be higher. Pepper's Flowers in Butler will charge \$20.00 per vase; however, people may now choose to share the flower sponsorship each Sunday. The Banner Project should provide a place to hang our banners in the library.

January Calendar





February 2 is known in our area for being Groundhog Day. However, it's also an ancient Christian Festival, the Presentation of Jesus, because forty days after Jesus was born (celebrated on 12/25), Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple to be dedicated. This festival marks the end of the "Season of Light," Christmas and Epiphany, and so the tradition of bringing candles to bless for the year attached itself to this festival. It became known as the Mass of the Candles, or Candlemas. Since it marks the end of the Christmas and Epiphany season, Candlemas is the time to take down nativity scenes and other decorations or they should be left up all year, according to tradition. Since February 2 falls on a Sunday this year, we will celebrate Candlemas. You are welcome to bring candles to bless. Also, there is a tradition from France of having crepes on Candlemas, so we will have a potluck "breakfast for lunch" after worship. Everyone is invited to share their favorite breakfast casserole or other dish, and that will be the meal for our annual congregational meeting.


