From the Pastor:



This past month, you had the opportunity to see four of our young people affirm their Baptisms and become adult members of the church. You also got to hear how they are a group of many questions. As is the case every year, but perhaps even more fitting for these inquisitive youth, they had to answer questions of mine as well on their Confirmation Test. It brings me joy every year to share some of their responses with you, because I

believe that it helps our church family to connect across our varied generations and life experiences. As you read through their responses, you may notice that you don't agree with all of their answers or had never thought about something in the same way. This is good. It reminds us that our faith is not to be static but rather, a living part of us. To be alive, it needs to be fed, exercised, watered, and challenged. I hope that you notice that in addition to my specific question about mercy, our theme for this year, our confirmands also found mercy to be an important part of their beliefs and prayers, since it showed up in their answers without me nudging them in that direction, at least not during the testing.

In Luke 6:36, Jesus is quoted as saying, "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." How is God merciful to you? How is God merciful to others? How does God's mercy impact your life? What does it mean to be merciful as your Father (God) is merciful?

- God's grace impacts my life in all ways. More specifically, leading by example and helping me to be merciful to others. To be as merciful as God is merciful is not possible for humans, because God is greater than us. However, we can try to forgive others, no matter the circumstances.
- God saves me from danger. God helps others in their time of need. God's mercy has helped me in my darkest times. Being merciful like God means that I have to be good and forgiving no matter what.
- God forgives me and forgives others. I know that God will forgive me. I want to be good and forgiving as God is.
- It means everyday things like picking up a piece of trash in the parking lot or swallowing your anger and forgiving someone when you have every right to be mad or take revenge. It's not taking advantage of a situation or person even when no one else would ever find out. It's showing up for people who can't show up for themselves or don't have anyone else to show up for them. Then together we become a community that builds each other up. A community that supports each other's goals. A community that wants each other to succeed. And a community that always shows up for one another.



Reception of Visitors: None

President Adam Price called the meeting to order at 7:09 PM. Following this, the Pastor shared a devotion that focused on *The Prodigal Prophet*, the summer book selection. He then led us in a discussion followed by prayers.

Minutes: Minutes from the May 13th meeting were read and approved. Staci motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded by Corey. Motion carried,

Pastor's Report: A detailed, written report was submitted that included Confirmation and many recent activities.

Treasurer's Report and the Financial Secretary's Report: These were reviewed and discussed. A motion to accept was made by Linda and seconded by Dan. The motion carried.

Financial: A written report was submitted. VENMO will be set up to try this month. The Lent offering received for Lutheran Disaster Response was \$2,322, and the Fasting for Change to LSS was \$281.28. The first quarter report of the Endowment Fund was \$76,540.08. Utilities are still a concern as they are higher in cost. The new gas supplier will take effect during the next billing cycle. Currently, there is about \$6,000 in undesignated funds in the Memorial Fund. Could some of this be used toward a building project or another idea? Thrivent cards continue to be helpful for church necessities. A sign up sheet sponsorship form is posted in Luther Hall for members to designate their choices. Portico will be changing the health plan offerings in 2026. The current fund deficit was discussed. It was suggested that a better understanding and more awareness of this issue needs to occur.

Fellowship: A written report was submitted. Receptions for Graduation and Confirmation were held on June 1st and June 8th. The Church Picnic will occur on June 22nd, and tickets are still available for the Pirate Game on June 21st. The Rege Rengers Cornhole Tournament is scheduled for June 28th. The Peach Potluck will be on July 20th and the Corn Roast on August 16th. The dates for Applefest are set for September 19-21, 2025, and will benefit the Evans City Fire Department in the amount of \$200.00 as well as the Priority Projects addressing the basement bathrooms and the electrical panel. After discussion, the Council supports this recommendation and it was seconded by Patti. Motion carried.

Learning Ministry/Youth: No written report was provided. Announcements reflected the dates for VBS that will be held at Westminster Church from June 23-June 27 and our own Morning Manna the week prior to this. Fourteen campers benefitted from the fundraising events for Camp Lutherlyn. Our church is responsible for the snacks during VBS this year.

Memorial: No written report was provided.

Mutual Ministry: No written report was provided.

Property: A written report was submitted, and a meeting was held on June 3rd. There is a need for a quality, riding lawn mower. Corey will replace the push mower. Perhaps some of the undesignated Memorial Funds could be used for this purpose. The motion was amended by Corey that we acquire a quality, used, riding mower. Motion carried. A new motion was made by Casey to approve Corey's 2nd motion. This also carried. Corey indicated that he will also take care of this.

It was suggested that we have a few weeks of advertisement for a brick sidewalk fundraiser with the proceeds going to Priority Projects. Ace Hardware provided a carpet scrubber free of charge for our use during the Property work day. Numerous projects listed on the chalkboard still need to be accomplished. On Friday, September 26th, the floors in Luther Hall will be scrubbed and rewaxed. The fire extinguishers need to be checked. In June, the backflow preventer will also be checked. Perhaps a Thrivent card could be used to paint and redecorate the Nursery. The previous decor had to be removed due to mold. We will use Don's Glass to replace the broken window pane in the Education Building.

Worship and Music: No written report was submitted. The change to a new liturgical setting will occur on June 22nd. On June 29th there will be a Baptism. An outdoor service will be held on August 3rd.

Unfinished Business:

Church Constitution Update: No report.

Clothing Cupboard: The Reopening Day was on June 6th.

<u>Church Secretary</u>: An ad was generated, and there have been several applicants for this position. Christine Johns and Heidi Beahm are currently working together until this position is filled. Adam moved, and Corey seconded the motion to have Pastor handle this hiring issue. Motion carried.

New Business/Miscellaneous:

<u>Rummage Sale</u>: Start saving items for the fall sale during Evans City's Pumpkinfest sometime in September.

<u>Building Use Request</u>: There was to be a guest this evening regarding this; however, no one appeared.

Due to a conflict, the next meeting is scheduled for August 7, 2025, at 7:00 P.M.
