Pastor's Page (Continued)

Psalm 150:6 says, "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord," and Psalm 34:1 says, "I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth." This isn't just some for Jewish people or the Old Testament, as the author of Hebrews writes, "Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise – the fruit of lips that openly profess his name." Why do we praise God? What does it look like to praise God in your life? How do our actions play a part in praising God? How do we praise God in hard times? What role does Jesus play in our praise of God?

- We praise God because his is the beginning and the end, because he is the truth, the way, and the life. We cannot get to heaven without believing in him. Write a prayer:

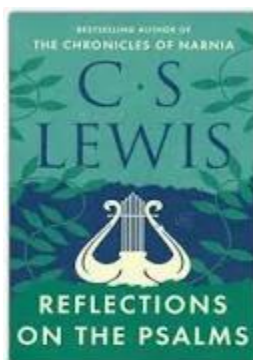

Recognition Sunday will be held June 7th.

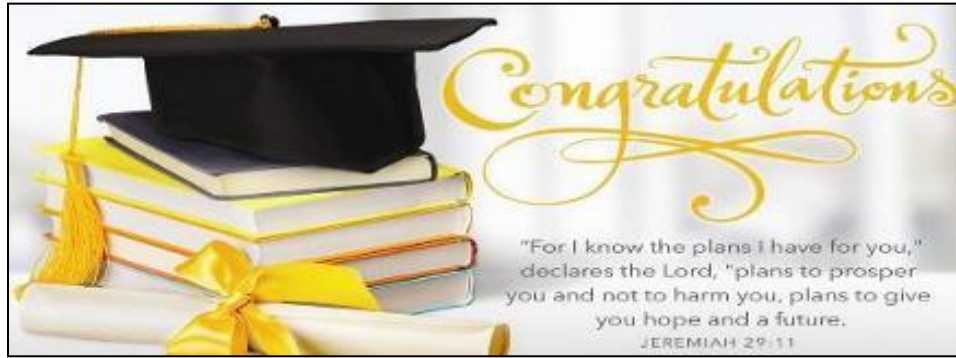

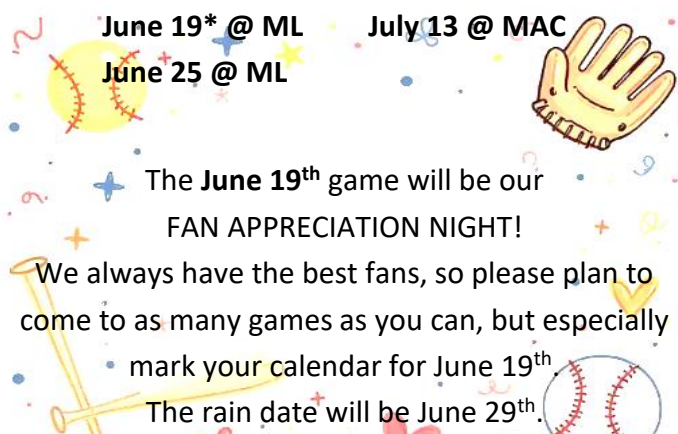

Devotions: President Ted Lindgren called the meeting to order at 7:09 P.M. Following this, the Pastor shared topics ranging from online Amazon reviews to those about faith and denominations and how they relate to online praise and evangelism. Discussion and prayers came after this.
