From the Pastor:



¹Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; in your great compassion blot out my offenses.

¹²Restore to me the joy of your salvation and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit. Psalm 51:1,12

Despite his popularity, I don't think that I've read more than one of the books that Nicholas Sparks has written. However, I have read at least a few of their Wikipedia pages and watched at least that many of the movies based on them, because they're interesting and well, truthfully, girls. Oh,

I don't mean my girls now, Lily, Anna, and Kate, because this was before them. Years ago, Nicholas Sparks books and movies helped facilitate conversation with girls by an otherwise very shy and awkward younger version of me. Now, at least one of his books can help us to facilitate understanding the season of Lent better.

In The Notebook, which is one I saw in theaters, elderly Noah is reading the love story of a young couple to an Alzheimer's disease-stricken Allie. We come to learn (spoiler alert twenty years later) that they are married and the love story is theirs. Because of her terrible and too-common disease, Allie doesn't remember Noah or the life and love they shared. However, the "notebook" sparks (pun intended) her memory, if only fleetingly, which allows them a grace period of restored time.

Busyness, selfishness, and pride or depression and self-loathing can all lead to the terrible and too-common symptom of forgetting our relationship and love story with God. Lent serves as a "notebook" that draws out highlights from the wider salvation story that is told throughout the Bible. We return to it year after year, hoping that it cuts through the fog that clouds our hearts and minds, restoring the memory we hold of God's passion for us.

During the season of Lent, we are reminded that God has loved us and all humanity from the beginning, and yet we have spurned God's love and the many and various ways God sought throughout history to repair our relationship. Lent reminds us that we become self-absorbed and as a result, cut ourselves off from the only true source of life, God. This is sin and its devastating effects. However, God never gives up and so loved the world that he poured himself into humanity and poured himself out to us through death on the cross. In Jesus' death and resurrection, we have been given the means of salvation. Faith trusts this to be so, and through it we find peace with God (Romans 5:1). Far too frequently, we forgo this peace, forgetting it was won for us or that we ever needed it at all.

Peace is lived forgiveness. Jesus has given us this peace with God. Martin Luther's professor colleague and friend Philip Melanchthon wrote in his Defense of the Augsburg Confession that peace with God equates to "consciences that are tranquil and joyful before God" (4.91). Being reminded about that in us which separates us from God doesn't need to terrify us, but rather allows us to more deeply appreciate the depth of love God has for us. Trusting in God's love, we live forgiven. The only thing that is fleeting about this peace, this tranquility and joy of our inmost selves, is our own living memory of it, because God has promised it as a gift to us forever.

Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. Remember that all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. Remember that the wages of sin is death. Remember that God saw all that he had made and called it very good. Remember that God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. Remember that the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Remember, rejoice, and may the peace won for you by Christ through the cross be with you always.



Keeping the Word Alive Vigil (March 29-31)

Holy Week is one of the most spiritually intense times of the whole year, and mirroring the way the Gospels slow down to follow Jesus' every move during his passion week provides us with rich ground for strengthening the roots of our faith. From the conclusion of our Good Friday evening service until the beginning of Easter service, we will be participating in Keeping the Word Alive at the Foot of the Cross. For about thirty-six hours, we will read continually through the Gospel of John, broken only by readers taking time for prayer or using other provided devotional material to reflect on the magnitude of Jesus' sacrificial love for us. Our thirty-six hour vigil represents the time Christ lay dead in the tomb, but giving audible voice to God's Word reminds us that death is not the victor in this battle. Also this time of incarnating the Word teaches us that we not only play a part in Jesus' death but in the on-going life of his Body. There will be a poster in Luther Hall where you can take a slot or slots to be a reader. If you would prefer not to be in the building alone, please consider asking someone to be a partner with you during your time slot. If you need help finding a person to keep watch with you, please reach out to Pastor.

Please consider this opportunity to live into Jesus' request of the disciples at Gethsemane to remain with him and stay awake with him (Mt 26:38), and if you have any questions please talk to Pastor or the Worship Committee. Although reading from the sanctuary offers some of the deepest spiritual benefits, we will again offer the opportunity to read from home through Zoom.



Reception of Visitors: None

President Adam Price called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM, and Pastor shared a reading from *The Apology of the Augsburg Confession*, and led us in discussion and prayer.

Minutes: Minutes from the January 9th meeting were read and adjusted. Patti motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded by Rita. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report and Financial Secretary's Report: Written reports were submitted and approved. The Food Cupboard funds have increased this month. We carried a positive balance for this report. Staci motioned to accept and it was seconded by Rob. Motion carried.
