



From the Pastor

*“Come, let us worship and bow down,
let us kneel before the Lord our maker.” ~Psalm 95:6*

On Transfiguration Sunday, the children sat transfixed, eyes locked on the box they recognized from last PumpkinFest as a treasure chest. It had been a pirate theme, and completing the challenge of finding all the pieces to the map in the spooky house granted them a treasure from that very chest. There were toys, stickers, and even “gold” dollar coins available. As I watched them, I could practically see their imaginations running wild with what other treasures might be revealed in that chest. However, when we opened it, the chest was empty.

The point there was twofold. One being that our praise, like the ornate wooden chest, can appear rich and full, but actually be empty inside. Our sin, our lived distrust of the providence of God, separates us from God. Those places within ourselves that house the spirit of God become hollowed out whenever we push God and God's will for us to the periphery. Likewise, our praise, which mirrors our hearts, becomes drained of its real meaning, hollowed out, whenever our lives fail to reflect attunement to God.

Like a treasure chest without treasure inside, words of praise without actions that would bring God praise appear pleasing but are really disappointing. Lent, then, is the time that we collectively have set aside for course correction. Repentance, worship, fasting, prayer, and works of love, the disciplines of Lent, help us to open our hollow spaces to God's presence in us. As we become more attuned to God with us, alive in us, our will comes into greater harmony with God's intention for us. With hearts filled with the love of God, we begin to understand and live the true righteousness that God desires of us and return the vibrancy to our praise. None of this should be reserved for the season of Lent alone, but that is the season upon us, so now is the time.

Days later, Kate asked me if the letters spelling our word of highest praise were still in the treasure chest, or if I took them out and then just pretended the box had something in it. Friends, let me assure you, like I did Kate, that the letters are still in there, waiting. This is the second point of the message from that day. We put our word of highest praise in a treasure chest, as a reminder that praise is a treasure. It should not be demeaned, discounted, or dismissed. God highly values our praise, wove it into the plan for Creation even. If the Creator of the Cosmos, the Holy One, so treasures our praise, then we do well to remember its great worth.

Pastor's Page *(Continued)* and March Volunteers

On Ash Wednesday, we heard again Jesus teaching his disciples and the crowd that we should store our treasure with God, because our heart will be where our treasure is (Mt 6:19-21). Remember that your praise is treasure. Therefore, whatever we praise with our actions and words has some piece of our hearts, our very selves. Let us not waste our valuable praise on that which is not of God, which is like handing ourselves over to death. Rather, like the letters in the chest in the nave, let us store our praise in God, whose heart is the best of all treasure chests.

In this season where our word of highest praise is buried, we remember that we buried it in the Lord, who alone can breathe new life into it. Accordingly, we do not cease to praise God, but ask for God's blessing to help us to truly praise God with all that we say and do, so that vitality returns. May the Holy Spirit fill the hollow spaces in your hearts and lives, bringing your spirit from death to life. As you then live and love with God's own heart, may your praise be resurrected with Christ. Beloved, may your treasure always be held safely in the eternal hands of God.

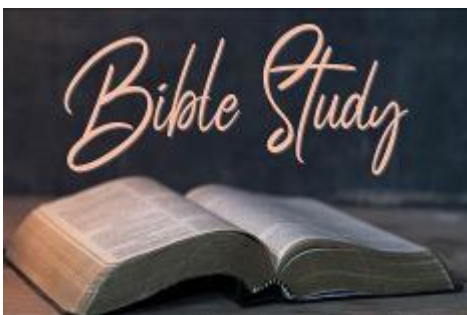

Lent & Holy Week



Holy Week is one of the most spiritually intense times of the whole year, and mirroring the way the Gospels slow down to follow Jesus' every move during his passion week provides us with rich ground for strengthening the roots of our faith.

From the conclusion of our Good Friday evening service until the beginning of Easter service, we will be participating in Keeping the Word Alive at the Foot of the Cross. For about thirty-six hours, we will read continually through the Gospel of Matthew, broken only by readers taking time for prayer or using other devotional material to reflect on the magnitude of Jesus' sacrificial love for us. Our thirty-six hour vigil represents the time Christ lay dead in the tomb, but giving audible voice to God's Word reminds us that death is not the victor in this battle.

Also, this time of incarnating the Word teaches us that we not only play a part in Jesus' death but in the on-going life of his Body. There will be a poster in Luther Hall where you can take a slot or slots to be a reader. If you would prefer not to be in the building alone, please consider asking someone to be a partner with you during your time slot. If you need help finding a person to keep watch with you, please reach out to Pastor.

Please consider this opportunity to live into Jesus' request of the disciples at Gethsemane to remain with him and stay awake with him (Mt 26:38), and if you have any questions please talk to Pastor or the Worship Committee. Although reading from the sanctuary offers some of the deepest spiritual benefits, we will again offer the opportunity to read from home through Zoom.

Lenten Giving – This year's Fasting for Change donations will go to Lutheran Service Society with a focus on their foster care program for children. Coin boxes are on tables in Luther Hall or you are welcome to mark the "Other" line on your contribution envelope LSS. You may choose to donate weekly, or give the sum of your savings at the end of Lent. Our offerings made during Meager Meals and in the Lent Special Offering envelopes will go to Priority Projects as we raise funds to pay for our downstairs bathroom renovations.

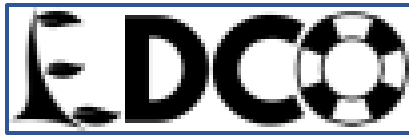

February 10, 2026

Present: Staci Bettencourt, Pat Capella, Bev Critchlow, Patti Flach, Casey Guerriero, Jan Hogan, Pastor Johns, Ted Lindgren II, Robin Plank (Zoom), Linda Schmidt, Robin VanDyke, Marge Wearing

Absent: Corey Walker

Reception of Visitors: None

President Ted Lindgren called the meeting to order at 7:10 P.M. Following this, the Pastor and Council members discussed memories about the doxology. Afterwards prayers were shared.

Minutes: Minutes from the January meeting were read and approved as amended (Ted nominated Robin to be VP). Patti motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded by Linda. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: A detailed, written report was submitted that included numerous activities, such as the MLK Volunteer Day, as well as several meetings and a change to a Saturday service due to the weather. Robin motioned to approve and it was seconded by Pat Capella. Motion carried

Treasurer's Report and the Financial Secretary's Report: The January report was reviewed and discussed. Concerns regarding the bill from the Sewer and Water Authority needs to be investigated. A motion to accept was made by Robin and seconded by Jan. The motion carried.

Financial: A written report was submitted. A recommendation to consolidate the Church's and Manna Night's petty cash to one account was made. The Lent offering from the envelopes and Meager Meals is recommended to be designated for the bathroom renovations/Priority Projects. In addition, Fasting for Change has been designated to the Lutheran Service Society. The bathroom renovation project was previously approved at the Bulletin of Reports. Funding for this will reflect this order: priority projects, undesignated and family approved memorial donations, and a loan from the St. Peter's youth money market account. Pat seconded the recommendation. Motion carried.

Fellowship: A written report was submitted. The Fish Dinner is being planned for March 20th from 4:00-6:30. \$200 raised from this will be given to EDCO Park. The remaining amount will go toward the Priority Project. Casey seconded this. Motion carried.

Learning Ministry/Youth: No written report was submitted; however, a Youth calendar has been sent out to families..

Memorial: No written report was provided.

Mutual Ministry: No written report was provided. Brief feedback focusing on the Pastor's Annual Report occurred.

Property: A detailed, written report was submitted. It was suggested that a different exterminator be hired to take care of the vole situation that affects the Daffodil Cross. Jan seconded it, and the motion carried. In addition, topics included boiler issues, the possibility of an Eagle Scout project, the potential paving of the driveway, and several other items.

Worship and Music: A written report was submitted. It addressed the Bulletin of Reports and Luncheon, Shrove Tuesday, Ash Wednesday, Meager Meals and other topics. A Seder Meal; is planned for April 2nd. Linda seconded these recommendations. Motion carried.
