



From the Pastor:

“O Lord, give strength to your people;
give them, O Lord, the blessings of peace.” Psalm 29:11

Shalom. Shalom is Hebrew for peace, but it’s more than an absence of conflict. Shalom is intended to convey God’s peace, which is the ideal state for which humanity was created. Of course, you remember this summary from February’s newsletter. Perhaps you knew all of that already when I shared about how shalom is the classic and still appropriate way to greet someone in Hebrew. Paul and Jesus used shalom in their greetings routinely, although its routine usage shouldn’t diminish the depth of its gift.

Centuries later, it’s still the Israeli-culturally appropriate, way better greeting than our English “hello.” Shalom is also the proper word to use at times of parting as well.

All along, I had planned to follow up February’s look at the blessing, greeting nature of the hello shalom with a look at the goodbye version. I didn’t think it would end up being quite so early in the year. However, since I’m saying a goodbye of sorts myself, it seems like the right time. Hold on St. Peter’s sisters and brothers, catch your breath. I’m not saying goodbye to us. St. Paul and Zion have agreed to bring on Pastor Erin Evans as your full-time Intentional Interim, which means my run as Acting Pastor and then Local Interim Pastor concludes at the end of this month. Even as roles change, we remain brothers and sisters in Christ and ministry partners, just as we were before, except now I believe that our fellowship is stronger for the time we have been in partnership in these new ways. The goodbye shalom is like that too, I think.

Already, we were serving on synodical committees together. Already, we had friendships that reached between our three congregations. Yet, we didn’t translate into closer ministry partnerships. Over the last fifteen months, here and there we attended each other’s worship services. We attended and donated to each other’s dinners. We had joint youth group events. We grieved some of the same losses and more intentionally prayed for each other. Shalom. This is the goodness of God. There is no need for it to end, just because a goodbye is happening. God is wider than that.

Whenever we greet someone, the truth is that there has always been a connection with that other person, whether they appear to be a random stranger or our oldest friend. We are all created by God as part of the human family. We had more relational connections than we realized. Now they have been fostered and grown. God's peace recognizes that the bonds we form with others in love should not diminish or end, just because a parting must take place. God is able to hold them for us and maintain them in our hearts.

Bonded in peace by love, we understand better than ever that our well-being is connected to the well-being of all others, especially those for whom the bonds of love feel the strongest. The reality of that connection means that I cannot have true peace unless you have God's peace as well. I really mean you. If you've taken the time to read this far in this article, then we certainly have a strong enough relationship that we are bound together in loving peace by God in God's kingdom. Although the earthly nature of our relationship changes, sometimes that's for seemingly good or bad reasons and this time certainly a good reason, our spiritual connections in the shalom of God do not change.

This is what makes shalom such a wonderful expression of blessing given at times of leave taking as well. Ok, take a moment to laugh at me. That was my way of saying that "Shalom" makes for a way better expression of "Good-bye," just like it's a better "Hello." There's the short, to the point version that I leave out sometimes. God's peace offered when we part acknowledges our connection. It says that our time together has been a blessing, a gift from God. It also acknowledges your value as a person is equal to mine, and your place in my heart is special.

Whenever people part company and shalom is offered, it is also an expression of hope. We communicate that we hope that all will go well and be well with them. Because God's peace is the ideal state of personal and relational wholeness for which God created us, offering that peace at a time of parting conveys the hope and faith that God will hold the other person or people in God's gracious hands, caring for the other in ways we couldn't even when we were together and certainly not after we depart. Shalom means we want God's abundant life for the other person or people and trust that God will make it so.

Within that hoped for abundance of life in God's way, I believe that a parting shalom is both a request for and an offering of forgiveness. Even with those whom we love most dearly, we are bound to falter and mess something up. That is true for no one more so than me. I cannot live fully into the divine life of God feeling



unforgiven for mistakes that I made, so I say shalom hoping for forgiveness. Likewise, I cannot live fully into the divine life of God carrying a grudge, so I say shalom offering forgiveness. This is the Way of the Kingdom, as I understand it.

I'm still that pastor at St. Peter's, and I hope to be for a long time. Pastor Erin Evans is now the pastor at Zion and St. Paul; however we are all still partners in ministry, and I hope to be for a long time. In all of our life's journeys, the ebbs and flows move us in and out of greater and lesser awareness of connection. God's peace to you in our greetings. God's peace to you in our partings. May God bind us in love and hold us all in eternally caring hands always. Shalom. God's peace be with you.

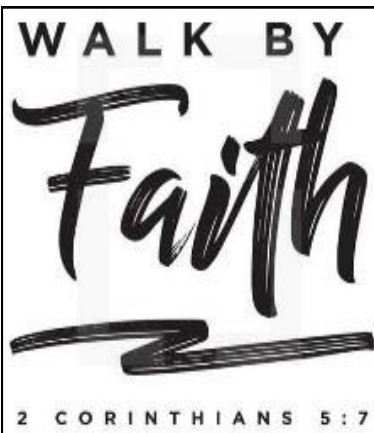

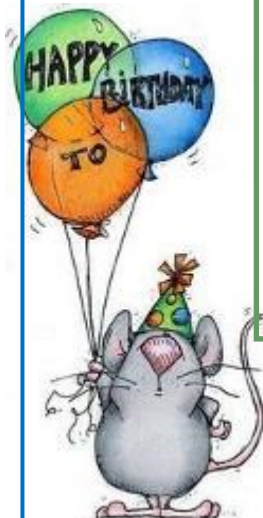

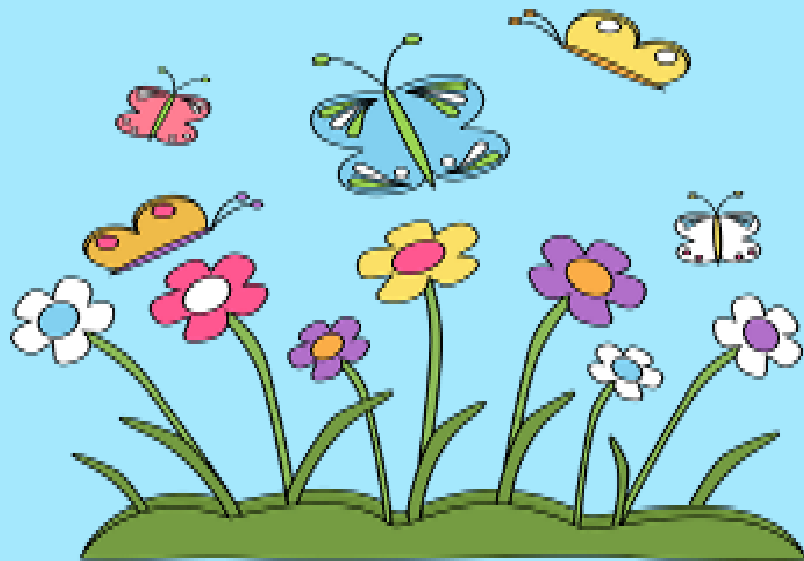
