



From the Pastor

⁸*Bless our God, you peoples; let the sound of praise be heard.*
¹⁶*Come and listen, all you who believe, and I will tell you what*
God has done for me. ²⁰*Blessed be God, who has not rejected my prayer,*
nor withheld unfailing love from me. ~Psalm 66:8, 16, 20

This past Sunday, we had a Learning Ministries meeting after worship (and cake). We were happy to report that Manna Night and After School had picked up a couple more youth participants over the last few months. However, even for those ministries, there was a consistent theme – *It would be great if more children were there participating.* To be sure, we are thrilled with the upswing of children at Manna Night and for those who have been regulars in our Christian Education ministries for years. The reality is, though, every program needs participants in order to thrive.

Even though After School Program, Manna Night, Youth Groups, Sunday School, Kid Camp, and Vacation Bible School could all use more children participating, it is not primarily the health and future of those ministries that is my biggest concern. The health and future of our youth and youth of our communities weighs even more heavily on my heart. You see, each one of those ministries has the capability to be positively transformational for our young people. Our adult volunteers faithfully create spaces for and care for children in ways that let them know who God is and what God's love truly is. Seeds of faith are planted and replanted, and the roots and shoots of the tender growth are lovingly nurtured. Absent of these experiences, we put our children at risk of struggling to develop the resiliency, self-assurance, generosity, empathy, and graciousness that the stories and lived experiences in the community of faith afford them.

The bottom line is children need several positive adult relationships in order to become healthy young adults. Really, we all do, but as the hearts and minds of children are being shaped as they grow, this is especially important for them. I truly believe this is one of the fundamental reasons that Jesus insisted his followers be a community that is like an extended family. I also truly believe that there is no church community out there that could be a better place for children to be nurtured and make positive adult relationships that shape them into resilient, faithful, loving human beings than at St. Peter's. Consequently, and out of the same love that led Jesus to invite children to himself, the world deserves to know God's Spirit is alive and at work here for them, or at least our neighbors should know.

Pastor's Page (Continued)

Unfortunately, evangelism scares people. We think it's scary, or somehow rude, to talk about God, our faith, or our church. This is where praise steps in as a simple solution to our hesitancy to be verbal witnesses or invitational. For years, I have been saying that we gladly tell other people about restaurants we enjoy, movies and books we like, and anything else we think someone else might benefit from or enjoy like us. Why would telling people about our God, our faith, and our church be any different? I doesn't need to be, and recently I discovered that C.S. Lewis agrees with me.

Of course, C.S. Lewis is not familiar with Yelp or Facebook posts but he did come to discover that praising God is part of the natural way of human life. In *Reflections on the Psalms*, Lewis shares that he wasn't always Christian and the part about praising God seemed to diminish God. Over time, he came to realize that God's demand of praise is not a matter of flattery, egotism by God, or God's actual need at all, but rather that God is simply the most worthy object of praise by nature once we are aware of the awesomeness of God. Similarly, a glorious sunrise demands attention and recognition because anything less would reflect poorly on the viewer, not the sunrise.

He adds that our joy of that moment isn't complete unless we share about it, which is to sing the praises of that sunrise, or in this case, God. Lewis writes:

I had not noticed either that just as men spontaneously praise whatever they value, so they urge us to join them in praising it: 'Isn't she lovely? Wasn't it glorious? Don't you think that magnificent?' The Psalmists in telling everyone to praise God are doing what all men do when they speak of what they care about. My whole, more general, difficulty about the praise of God depended on my absurdly denying to us, as regards the supremely Valuable, what we delight to do, what indeed we can't help doing, about everything else we value.

Upon reflection, C.S. Lewis noticed that people praise things and people routinely in our lives and frequently invite others to join us in noting the praise-worthy attributes of the object of our praise so they can rightfully join us. Praise is natural, authentic evangelism.

The flavor of this is so delicious; you've got to try it! Look at the colors in this quilt; isn't it lovely? I've got a great place; let me tell you about it! I know a wonderfully caring God and church; come and see! Oh, you think my girls are great? Thank you! They are that way because they've learned about the grace, love, and self-giving nature of God through Jesus and his people at St. Peter's. We have a place for you (and your family) here, too. God is good!

Mowers – Anyone who is interested in mowing & trimming this season, and is not already on the volunteer list, please contact Pastor Johns.

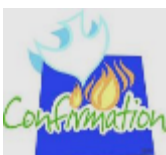


Property Work Day

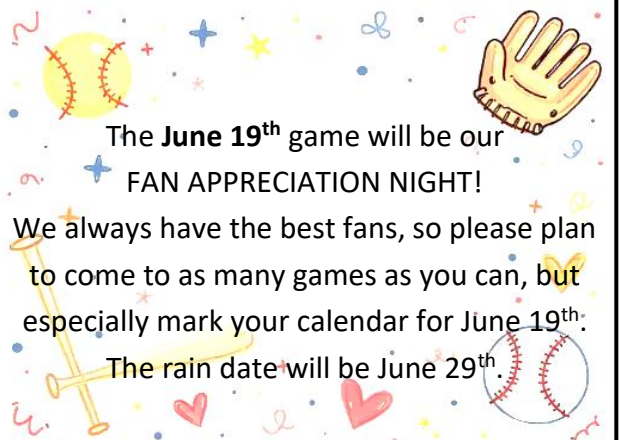

April 14, 2026

President Ted Lindgren called the meeting to order at 7:12 P.M. Following this, Pastor shared topics from *For the Glory of God*, The Nature of the God of Israel section. Discussion and prayers came after this.

Minutes: Minutes from the March meeting were read and approved. Robin V. motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded by Bev. Motion carried.

Reception of Visitors: Dean represented the Evans City Historical Society and discussed the July 5th America 250 activity that they are planning from 1:00-3:00 P.M. that day. He came to request permission for the use of the church if there happens to be inclement weather on that day. Ted motioned to approve this request and Staci seconded it. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: A detailed, written report was submitted addressing numerous activities, including a Career Day presentation to 5th graders at Ehrman Crest, many Lenten worship activities, an April Trivia Night presenter session at the library, several meetings, home/hospital visits, and a funeral.

Learning Ministry/Youth: No written report was submitted. No official meeting was held; however work is progressing on the Summer Mission Trip planning for the week of July 19th. Patti motioned that she would like to have the monies raised from the May 1st and 2nd Rummage Sale distributed among Lutherlyn Camperships, the Mission Trip, After-School Program and Manna Night. Motion approved. (Later, a meeting date was established for April 26th, following the church service.)

Memorial: No written report was provided. No official meeting was held; however, some monies from Rege Rengers account have been approved by the family for the Bathroom Project.

Mutual Ministry: No written report was provided. No official meeting was held.

Property: A written report was submitted that included a review of the progress of the bathroom renovations. At the meeting, committee members also examined the upper lot in regards to the anticipated paving project. Work Day is scheduled to begin at 8:30 A.M. on Saturday, May 16th. Lawn mowers and lawn mowing were also discussed. There is a rotation of volunteers. Wind damage occurred to the parsonage's garage.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 12, 2026 at 7:00 P.M.

Adjournment and Prayer: The meeting was adjourned at 8:14 P.M. Pat moved to adjourn and it was seconded by Marge. Motion carried. The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

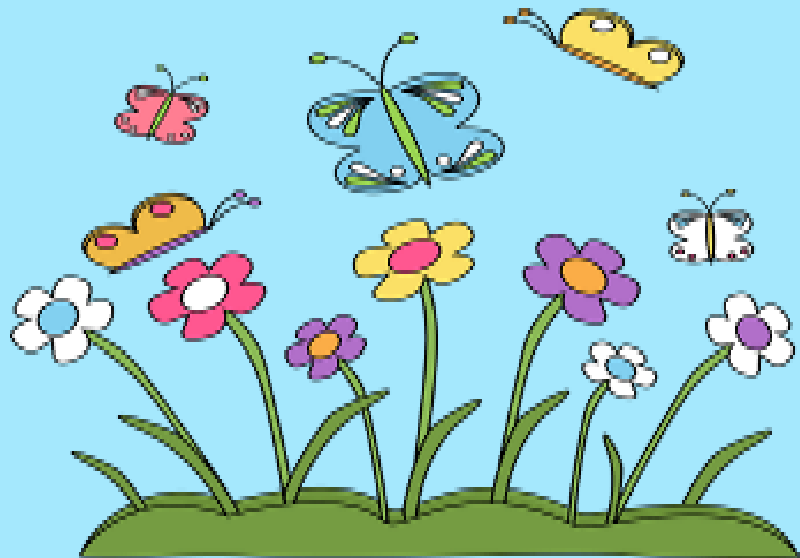
