From the Pastor:

"The LORD makes wars cease to the ends of the earth.

He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.

He says, 'Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations,

I will be exalted in the earth.'" Psalm 46:9-10

Right now, I'm sitting in my hotel room in Chicago. It's not downtown Chicago. This hotel is on some kind of strange island or isthmus with highways on parallel sides of it, but there's still nowhere near the commotion that I assume would be audible if the ELCA Churchwide offices and the hotel it uses were actually downtown. Maybe Charlie could tell me if I'm right or wrong about that. Either way, it's just me and the HVAC system for noise, and right now, I'm not talking to myself, at least not out loud. Nevertheless, this very nice room, for which I am very grateful, only fulfills the quiet part of the phrase "peace and quiet."

Maybe for you, a nice hotel room by yourself would be the most peaceful thing you could imagine this side of heaven. Not me, I never trust the carpets in a hotel room, so I can't ever truly be at peace. Also, this room isn't really mine. On the other hand, I don't own any of the places I find peace, so that can't be it. I think it's because there are other places where I am better able to be still and know God.

My peace places include the church building, especially the nave (except right now), the beach, the woods, and fishing spots. None of them are perfect. Sometimes, it can be too windy or chilly to be still at the beach. If you're not sure, ask just about anyone from the congregation who went to the beach this year. Others have their potential pitfalls too, often weather-related since my backups to the nave are generally outside. Despite their imperfections, as the waves come lapping in or as the wind rustles the leaves, I can feel myself breath more deeply and evenly. I feel lighter. Funny how such a weighty thing as peace can so easily lift my spirit.

You might ask why I am better able to be still surrounded by trees than a temperature controlled room with indoor plumbing. That's a good question. Perhaps it's the degrees of separation from God's own handiwork. To be sure, God is here with me in my room in Chicago, and God's fingerprints can be found all over this place. However, the furniture and design are more secondhand, transfers those fingerprints, rather than the direct image that Creation itself offers us. From hills to dales, from seashore to riverbank, I can almost put my hand in the very handprint of God. That quiets me, stills the most strident sound storming within me, like remembering that singing the *Sanctus* joins my voice with that of the angels at the very throne of God.

Our God makes wars to cease. I look forward to the day when that means Russians and Ukrainians, Israelis and Palestinians, and all other people can live in peace as neighbors instead of enemies. For now, I am grateful that God can and does make the war that rages within me to cease. What war? The same that fights for supremacy in all of us - thirst for power clamoring to be heard, retribution shouting to take control, and a thousand other raucous voices fighting God and each other for control of my heart, as all the while the discordant whispers of despair try to rule.

God's strength of love defeats them all. If not, I would gradually grow to accept the din of battle raging in my soul as status quo. Perhaps it would be. It shouldn't be. No, instead, each time that the glow of God's peace breaks through the storm clouds yet again, I am reminded that I wasn't made to live that way. I was made to be lighter. I was made for peace. You are too. Breathe it in. Breathe it out.

Jesus needed those times, too, and I'm glad. Otherwise, every time I realized that I need the peace of quiet stillness, I would feel like I was wasting God's time or shirking my duties. Jesus gives us permission and the blueprint. He goes up the mountain himself or with a few of his most trusted companions and prays. I think it's safe to say in those moments of stillness, he knows again God in him and him in God, and his well of peace is refreshed. Jesus doesn't stay up or out, but finds his way back to people and his ministry among them, like us back to the lives we continue to lead but reminded that these lives are God-given mission fields for maximizing the praise of God.

Communal worship is a place of praise and peace, knowing God and being known by God. It is a treasure that shouldn't be taken for granted. In addition, I pray that you have or find other places where you can be still and know God as well. May God who makes wars to cease quiet the clashing cacophony inside you until the still, small Voice can be heard saying, "Be at peace; I love you."

St. Peter's was able to provide a gift of \$2,334.00 to help them with their camping ministry.



On Saturday, September 7th many gathered together to assemble all those apple dumplings to be baked for apple fest 2024. Many thanks to all who helped!







President Adam Price called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM. Pastor shared a story about a visit to a former church member and provided a Dedication to the Dying and a reading of one of the family's favorite scriptures from Phillipians focusing on peace. He led us in a discussion that was followed by prayers.

Minutes: Minutes from the August 26th meeting were read and approved as amended. Corey motioned to accept the minutes and it was seconded

by Staci. Motion carried,

Fellowship: A written report was submitted. The always enjoyable wine and cheese event at the Raupp's was held on August 23rd. Our 175th Anniversary celebration dinner at Camp Lutherlyn is scheduled for October 6th. Thanks to donations, the cost has been reduced to \$10.00 and those under five years of age are free. Sign up. reservation sheets are available. The spaghetti dinner, fundraiser, Senior Project is planned for Saturday, October 12th. Plans are continuing for the annual September Rummage Sale and Apple Fest that will occur on the 20th and 21th during the Community Pumpkinfest. Many volunteers have been helping prepare for both the apple dumplings (1,256 were made!) and the apple butter. The turkey dinner is planned for November 16th. Nine tickets are still available for the Lancaster trip to see the play about Daniel.

Learning MInistry/Youth: A written report was provided. A meeting was held on September 2nd. Rally Day was an altogether occasion on September 8th. Ted Lindgren (senior) will be taking over the Adult Sunday School class. Manna Night began on Wednesday, August 28th. Greeters should arrive no later than 20 minutes before worship time. One person should stand near the main doors in the back of the nave and one should stand near the entrance to the nave from Luther Hall. Greeters should hand out the bulletins to those people arriving and have a friendly greeting. Greeters also should assist any visitors who arrive. Greeters should remain in place until the bell rings.


