#### From the Pastor:

" 1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus,

<sup>2</sup> To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord." 2 Timothy 1:1-2

Recently, I was asked about my position and the wider Church's position on some social-theological issues. Such questions are part of being pastor and are a frequent part of Confirmation Class where our teens probe their faith as they grow and mature. Other times I get questions after worship or through text and email. They're always welcome. I try to be prepared to give thoughtful, insightful, honest answers at any time. This last set of questions came via email, giving me time to respond in my favorite way - read, reflect, and pray before talking or writing.

Answering on behalf of the wider Church especially leads me to read and reread. I want to make sure I am giving an authentic voice to our Church's true positions, not just my particular interpretation of them. However, even answering for myself alone, I prefer to avail myself to Biblical research and the carefully thought out positions of others in order to continue to test and reshape or reaffirm my stances and beliefs. After all, our faith is called by God to be living and growth is certainly a part of living.

It was in that context, then, that I was pouring over our Church's Social Statements and scholarly works that served as their rationale for a few hours the other day. At the end of one of the documents, I came across a concluding heading that was very moving to me. It reads, "The necessity of mercy, always." In the subsequent paragraphs, the authors point out that sin creeps into all of our relationships so forgiveness and reconciliation, aspects of mercy, are necessary components of human relationships. This is not a new or modern feel-good message, but rather comes straight from the biblical witness.

As you can see in the verses above, the Book of 2 Timothy, presented as a letter from Paul to his protégé and former traveling companion Timothy, opens with a greeting that serves as a blessing of grace, mercy, and peace. I say the book is presented in this way, because it very well could be that St. Paul wrote this to Timothy who shows up often in Acts as well as the letters we are certain came from Paul. On the other hand, it is possible that a next generation Christian used the names of Paul and Timothy and their close relationship to frame the author's teachings, who bases those instructions on his understanding of what Paul would say to the Christian community that continued after Paul had died. Either way, what is most important from these verses is that even among two giants of the Early Church and Christian faith, it was understood that God's mercy needed to surround that relationship.

Paul and Timothy needed God's mercy to undergird their relationship. We do, too, in all of them, even with ourselves. Mercy doesn't look exactly the same in every circumstance. For example, in relationships broken by abuse, it might mean removing one's self from the situation and further contact with the source of abuse out of care for both individuals, but still praying for their well-being and even reaching out to that person's friends to make sure someone is there to help him or her get the mental help he or she needs. Mercy with ourselves might include accepting the forgiveness that God and/or others offer to us and striving to be better versions of ourselves while not continuing to beat ourselves up over shortcomings that God has long since left behind.

Acknowledging our failures, flaws, shortcomings, and sin are important parts of healthy, merciful relationships with ourselves and God, because they keep us grounded and also open to mercy. This same acknowledgement is also very helpful in our relationships with other people. Too often, we hold each other to a standard of perfection that we could never live up to ourselves, if we were being honest with ourselves. I make messes. I pull out in front of people. I lose my temper. I forget things. I fail to communicate clearly, or at all. I fall into temptation. I screw up in more ways that I can count, and yet, I repeatedly expect everyone else in my life to never do any of those things. At least, some of my reactions would communicate that I expected them to be perfect just like me. Except that I'm not and neither are they. Remembering that helps me to more readily respond with mercy rather than anger, because I know that is what I need as well.

As I mentioned above, sometimes mercy means a parting is necessary. However, that is supposed to be our last resort rather than our default, because as Christians, forgiveness and reconciliation are the tender arms of mercy meant to surround our relationships. Jesus' all-encompassing love and peace won through the cross show us the Way to the kind of mercy that repairs relationships over and over again (70x7 times, for example). When we don't think we just have that kind of mercy in us, remember that God is the source and provider of that mercy. God gives it and we administer it, much like the Sacraments.

Without God's mercy, we would be lost, condemned. Without mercy toward others, we end up being self-righteous, angry, frustrated, cut off, and lonely. That is not who God created us to be, nor the abundant life that Jesus means for his disciples. Therefore I encourage you, my sisters and brothers in Christ, to forgive as you have been forgiven and to be merciful as your heavenly Father is merciful. Repair and reconcile relationships as often as you can, bearing the burden of pardon and differences in love. In the rare, painful cases where dissolution of relationships are necessary because we still live in a broken word, offer a word of prayer on behalf of the other. We are still one human family, created by God.


Do not forget the necessity of mercy, always. To you, my beloved faith family, grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord, always.




