



<sup>2</sup>We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly <sup>3</sup>remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>4</sup>For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, <sup>5</sup>because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. <sup>6</sup>And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, <sup>7</sup>so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. 8For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. <sup>9</sup>For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, <sup>10</sup> and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.


## GOSPEL: Matthew 22:15-22

<sup>15</sup>Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap [Jesus] in what he said. <sup>16</sup>So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. <sup>17</sup>Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" <sup>18</sup>But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? <sup>19</sup>Show me the coin used for the tax." God of Grace, receive our prayer.



Our offerings are made processionally, which means dropped into the plates located near the entrances to the nave.





<u>Turkey Dinner</u> – Our annual Turkey Dinner will be on Saturday, November 4<sup>th</sup>. *All donations, except for pies and dinner rolls, are due to the church by October 29<sup>th</sup>. Pies and rolls are due by 10:00 November 4<sup>th</sup>.* All proceeds from our Turkey Dinner this year will go to the Jason family to support them in their ongoing medical battle.

<u>Choirs</u> – Our senior choir, Christmas Cantata choir, and bell choir have all restarted their rehearsals. These vitally important ministries only are able to continue as long as we step up and join together offering our time and talents on behalf of this community and to the glory of God. You can do it. You are needed.

<u>Reformation Sunday</u> – Next Sunday we celebrate God's ongoing work in the world through the Holy Spirit to keep the Church, God's Church, as people of the Way despite the forces that would mislead us or separate us from God and each other. We wear red as part of the celebration to honor the presence of the Holy Spirit.

<u>All Saints Sunday</u> – On Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup>, we give thanks to God in worship for the gift of baptism, which makes us a part of the community of saints because in baptism God sets us apart as holy people of God. We also honor God for the lives of those we love who have died in the previous year especially, but also any loved ones whose life and death we would like to remember before God. Members of our community who have died in the previous year will have their names read during the service and have a candle lit by Pastor as we remember that their light continues to shine in us and before God. Everyone will be invited to also light a candle for them or any other loved ones during the worship service.

<u>Congregational Meeting</u> – On Sunday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, we will have our annual congregational meeting. Please plan to stay after worship for that important part of our life together. We will consider and approve a mission spending plan (budget) for our community, as well as, elect people we believed to be called by God into leadership for this season in our congregation's life.

<u>Window Project</u> – We anticipate Williams Glass returning on October 30<sup>th</sup> to continue replacing old protective coverings over our exterior stained glass windows. Because of your support of this project, we were able to immediately sign up to have more windows receive this treatment upon completion of the first seven and then expand the scope for this second phase beyond what we thought possible at first. As long as all goes well, all windows on the main level of the church building should have new protective coverings at the end of this round of work.
