SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human" being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin. ²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction. ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God: ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law. This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

This is the Holy Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.



The response for each petition is: God of grace, hear our prayer.


Into your hands, O God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in the saving grace you freely give, both now and forever. **Amen.**


Our offerings are made processionally, which means dropped into the plates located near the entrances to the nave.




LORD'S PRAYER

As the whole roof is 16 years old, council accepted Property Committee's recommendation to replace the roof with a new metal one, which will happen in the coming weeks at the cost of a little over \$8,000.
