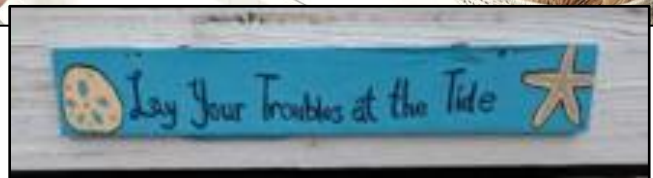

I feel I have gotten closer to God, too, this trip by realizing how blessed we really are and to not take things for granted.

I have seen God so much on this trip. One of the many examples of his was when we went to the beach for the sunrise the last day. All of us could truly feel and see God all around us. Another example would be our safety, because there were several times where we could have been in an accident or hurt by the waves but God was with us.

Some things I will carry with me from the trip are never judge a book by its cover, always depend on God, and people see your work.

As for my peers, we all instantly got along well and had fun together. Most of the people that attended this trip I have grown up with, but it wasn't until this trip that I really got to know them.

I have also seen God in every time we attended the homeless shelter. Everyone there was grateful and happy. Two of the people who made the most impact on me would be Janet and Victoria (a friend who came along). Janet was a very nice member of the community who attended the homeless shelter. She shared her life story and her faith with us. She had grown up in the Catholic Church and she patiently taught us how to preach the gospel to others who might have grown up in different religions, denominations, or faiths. Victoria made a significant impact on me by how she fearlessly preached the gospel. Every conversation and interaction she had with the community was either exemplifying Christ or talking to strangers about Jesus. On this trip, I have learned so much about myself. By watching others, I was able to have conversations with the people at the shelter about Jesus. I also learned to trust God through fearful situations. On the first day, I rode a wave that was definitely too big to be riding. After I hit my head on the bottom of the ocean floor and washed back up on the shore, I was scared and fearful. After getting crushed by many other waves, I realized something. Just like the waves always brought me back to shore, God's love will always bring me back to him.

There are many things I will carry with me after this trip, but the most important is to never judge a book by its cover. We met a lot of people who I would have classified as scary, but instead we talked to them. In the end, they were really sweet. At the homeless shelter we worked at we served dinners. There were a lot tables set up. One of the tables had a red table cloth. Everyone who had to sit there had made a mistake in their past. I was fortunate to talk to some of those people and I saw how a person who had made a bad decision can turn and repent to Jesus and how they can be totally renewed through his blood. I also learned how important it is to exemplify Christ's love to others. People were really grateful when we went to the homeless shelter. They kept telling us how we made their day and how we were able to add a little brightness to a really rainy day.

Lastly, I want to show my appreciation for every single one of you, for funding this trip and helping me grow in my faith. I am so grateful I was able to attend and get to know Christ better. Thank you all so much.



Victoria: On this trip, I learned a lot of new things about myself and others. I grew spiritually, emotionally, and mentally. I also grew in my speaking and I feel this trip was a tiny step out of my comfort zone. I'm grateful that I got to meet new people and grow relationships with them. I also really loved how this trip got me off my phone for the entire week. I also really enjoyed going to the beach for the first time! I also really, really loved sharing the highs and lows and then answering the devotion questions at the end of the day. That was really fun and I felt like I had a voice to speak about myself and also helped me get to know more about others through their answers.

There are so many ways that I grew closer to God and the church family. One of the ways that I grew closer to God was just knowing about his character more. I learned more about God's character through devotions and although I've heard about God's love time and time again, I'm in constant need of reminders of the character of God. Personally, I didn't really know many people that come, because I don't go to this church but I got to build new friendships and make memories with everyone that came and I'm so beyond grateful for that and everyone was so sweet, too.

I feel like on this trip, I was constantly experiencing God's presence. I saw God through the beauty of the scenery and the beach. I saw God in the people around me. I saw God in the service we provided and the joy brought to those we served. Most of all, I feel I experienced the presence of God when speaking to Janet, because I felt like God really sparked that conversation and the Holy Spirit gave me wisdom and knowledge and spoke through me to her but also God used her to speak to me.

I have learned a lot about myself but I think the biggest ones were related to how social I was. One is that I can talk to complete strangers perfectly fine as long as they are older or younger than me but anyone 10 years of age close to me, I get really frightened by. Secondly, a lot of people, about half that I stayed with, told me that I really changed from the beginning of the trip to like the second day, which to me, is very interesting and I want to look into that more.

I think the main thing that I will carry with me for a long time is the conversations I had with the homeless people and how insightful they were to me and their wisdom. I will also remember God's presence with me while I spoke to them about my belief in Jesus. I think that because of his presence, next time I talk about what I believe in, I can have peace that God is with me. The last thing that I want to remember clearly is to pray for the people we meet because someone from the homeless shelter asked me if I believe in prayer. I said yes, and he asked me to pray for all of the people at the shelter. That is something that I will carry with me.

Thank you for all of the amazing memories. Thank you for letting me join in on all the experiences. Thank you all for inviting me into your family on the first day before I could even remember your names. I'm so grateful for everything that happened and for every one of you.

Thank you all for the amazing experiences and the amazing first time on a mission trip and at the beach. Jesus loves you!

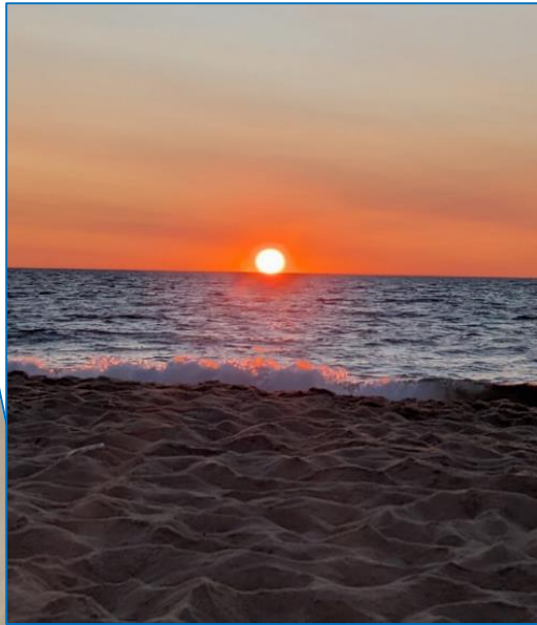

Also, in the way Victoria, the youth who started the conversation, talked to her you could see the Holy Spirit putting words to her mouth. This trip also gave me a chance to reflect on myself. I realize that sometimes I can be quick to judge and forget to keep an open mind. When we went to the homeless shelter, I thought it was going to be a bunch of grumpy people, but I quickly realized that they almost all had hope and that they were very happy to see youth doing God's will. Not only did that teach me something about myself, it is something that I will take with me for the rest of my life. Another thing that I will take with me, is how much a little act can mean to someone. Just by being there to serve food, weeding, or cleaning a shed you can make a huge impact on someone's day. I want to finish by saying how much I appreciate this opportunity. Without the community's support we wouldn't have been able to serve all of the people we did. This mission trip has changed us all for the better, and it is thanks to you that we could go. If you ever question what you're giving is actually going ,to just remember all of the people that I have mentioned us helping. Just by eating at a church dinner you're helping us serve others. I hope you understand how much good that this has done in my life and how thankful I am for this opportunity.

Just talking to him for a couple minutes about football and players was probably the highlight of the trip in my opinion, which really goes to show how such a simple conversation can impact someone. (That's the thing I'm going to carry with me.) This trip has brought me closer to God through daily devotions and sharing where I've seen God throughout the day made me acknowledge that H e is always with me. I really appreciate the effort put into make this trip memorable and fun, I met so many wonderful people and made new friends. Thank you!

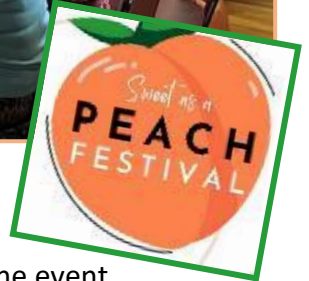
We join with Kim Fyock in her joy as we welcome her into our community of faith. She became a member of St. Peter's on July 12th.

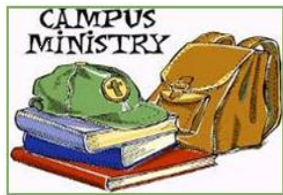
