



From the Pastor

*"Proclaim the greatness of the Lord and worship upon God's holy hill;
for the Lord our God is the Holy One." ~Psalm 99:9*

With all this snow on the ground and the temperatures often below zero lately, it seems hard to believe that just a few weeks ago, I was taking morning jogs on a beach in Florida. Of course, St. Augustine had cooler

than usual weather when we were there over Christmas break, and I ran a couple of mornings with socks over my hands, because I didn't think to pack gloves and my hands hurt without them. Still, it never got below the thirties at its lowest, which would be a heat wave here at this point.

One of the unforeseen wonders of going to the beach in winter was that the sunrise coincided with my regular wake up and run time. At Ocean City in the summer, the sun has already long since risen at the equivalent time, and the longer amount of daylight is great of course. However, getting to see the sun rise over the ocean every morning without having to wake up extra early was a definite bonus. Even though I saw it every morning of the four full days we were there, it never stopped being awe-inspiring.

These are the gimmes, the layups, the times when praising God should come easy to us. Don't let the wonder, nor the opportunities, pass you by, though, just because they're easy and obvious. A smile is shared. Recovery is made. Forgiveness is extended. Praise. Praise. Praise. These convenient sunrises help us to train for the days when they are harder to find.

I had a couple of days this week where I wasn't feeling my best, and as you know, temperatures are bitterly cold and the snow just won't quit. Yet, I am reminded that the sun still rose today, even if I didn't get to see it over the ocean. The snow, although not sand nor sea, still sparkles with a beauty all its own. People have been calling, texting, and posting on Facebook to check on me and wish me a happy birthday. Praise. Praise. Praise. It's hard to praise sometimes. Then there are stretches of life when it feels hard all the time. Nonetheless, God remains every bit as worthy of our praise.

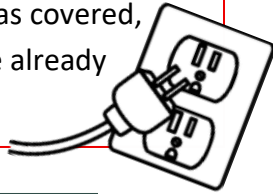

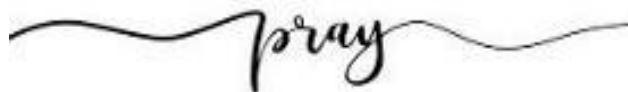

January 13, 2026

Pastor Johns called the meeting to order at 7:15 PM.

Pastor had devotions regarding how to "praise the Lord" from the book *Crazy Tales* by Rolf A Jacobson. Our theme this year is Praise.

Minutes: Corey motioned, Janice seconded to approve the minutes from December 2025 meeting. Motion carried.

Election of Officers: Ted Lindgren II was nominated by Bev, second by Corey to be president. Motion carried. Corey nominated, seconded by Janice to have Robin VanDyke as Vice President, Patti Flach as Secretary and Colleen Prenovitz as Financial Secretary & Heidi Beahm as Treasurer. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Written report submitted. Pastor had 3 funerals for Troy Barkley, Bea King & Joan Harbaugh. Pastor wrote the Christmas Program -The Song of Salvation and it was done on Dec. 21 and enjoyed by everyone. He continues to visit members in the hospital or at home. Continues to lead Bible study on Thursday evenings. Discussion on if we were planning to do another survey regarding Christmas Eve service times and not planning to do that at this time.

Treasurer's Report & Financial Secretary Report: Written reports submitted. We ended the year with a positive balance. Property: Written report submitted. New outlets installed in Luther Hall. Blower of left boiler was replaced. Corey reported about bids received for bathroom renovation. They were waiting for 1 more bid and that company decided to not bid. We currently have \$15,000 plus in the priority project fund. Committee recommends, seconded by Bev to move forward with bid from Olde Hickory Construction for \$34,000 and have the finance committee determine where to get funds for the remaining balance. Motion carried. Committee recommends supporting After School to secure a grant from the synod under Ethel Verney Fund to get the upper gravel parking lot paved. They have received a bid from Best Choice Paving. If they grant is not received the project will not proceed.

Worship & Music: No report. Reviewed Christmas & Advent and everyone like and appreciated the services and the cantata.

Unfinished Business: Constitution updates still need to be done by Michael Bettencourt and Dan Erin. Church secretary discussion held on if we should hire a new secretary? We appreciate the job Christine Johns is doing as interim. Ted motioned, seconded by Janice to keep Christine as the interim secretary through April council meeting. Motion carried.

New Business: Committee Assignments: Finance - Robin P. & Ted; Fellowship - Janice, Bev, Pat; Memorial - Ted & Robin V.; Learning Ministry-Staci, Casey, Patti & Robin V.; Mutual Ministry - Patti, Staci & Casey; Property - Corey, Robin P.; Worship & Music - Pat, Linda, & Marge

Corey motioned, seconded by Staci to assign \$3000.00 furnishing allowance on tax form for tax purposes. Motion carried.

Staci requested use of Luther Hall on Feb. 28, approved.
